Dear Senator Murman and Members of the Education Committee,

The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) is a federally funded initiative designed to ensure that children and teens have access to nutritious meals during the summer months when school is not in session. Administered by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), the program addresses food insecurity by providing free, healthy meals to eligible participants in communities nationwide.

On April 11th, 2012, Governor Heineman signed LB 1090, a bill introduced by Senator Wallman, which established a grant program for sponsors of the SFSP to aid in expanding and creating SFSP sites in Nebraska. LB 1090, now codified at Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 79-10,140 through 79-10,142, provides for the Nebraska Department of Education (NDE) to award grants to sponsors for nonrecurring expenses incurred in initiating or expanding services under the SFSP. Annual grants of up to \$15,000 are to be awarded on a competitive basis up to a total of \$90,000 per fiscal year.

Pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 79-10,142, NDE is reporting the following activity related to the Nebraska SFSP. During the summer of 2025, three Nebraska SFSP sponsors were awarded funds through the SFSP expansion grant totaling \$20,235. These grant funds impacted 714 children in those rural communities. Projects included (1) commercial highchairs to support meal service for younger children at the SFSP site in Kimball, (2) heated proofing cabinets and coolers to support high-quality and nutritious meals at the SFSP site in West Point, and (3) outreach supplies, a commercial fruit sectionizer, and several pieces of meal delivery equipment purchased to support reaching and serving more meals to community children at the SFSP site in Superior.

Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) Expansion Grant

I. Introduction

Pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 79-10,142, the Nebraska Department of Education (NDE) is required to submit a report related to the SFSP by December 1 each year.

II. Background

On April 11th, 2012, Governor Heineman signed LB 1090, a bill introduced by Senator Wallman, which established a grant program for sponsors of the SFSP to aid in expanding and creating SFSP sites in Nebraska. LB 1090, which is codified in Neb. Rev. During the summer of 2025 three Nebraska SFSP sponsors were awarded funds through the SFSP expansion grant totaling \$20,235. These grant funds impacted 714 children in those rural communities. Projects included (1) commercial highchairs for younger children in Kimball, (2) heated proofing cabinets and coolers in West Point, and (3) outreach supplies, a commercial fruit sectionizer, and several pieces of meal delivery equipment in Superior.
