# ANNUAL REPORT AND RESOURCE GUIDE

# July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025

In fiscal year 2025 the Nebraska Lottery reached a new milestone with over \$1 billion back to our state since 1993. Lottery ticket sales during the fiscal year were \$185.4 million. Proceeds transferred to the beneficiary funds were \$45.7 million.

Other notable highlights from fiscal year 2025 included Mega Millions® game enhancements and updates to the Lottery mobile app. Birthday coupons for lottery players moved online. And the chance to take home a new SUV drove sales of holiday Scratch games.

Finally, we continued a long-standing relationship with retailers, who received \$11.9 million in commissions during the fiscal year. Other highlights for the fiscal year include:

- · Collected \$749,968 in state income taxes from prize winnings;
- · Collected \$26,052 in unpaid taxes; and
- Collected \$54,725 in unpaid child support.

We are proud to serve the citizens of our state by providing trusted, quality entertainment while delivering maximum return for good causes with Lottery proceeds. Together, we are Helping to Build a Better Nebraska<sup>®</sup>.

# GENERAL INFORMATION

The Nebraska Lottery sells \$1, \$2, \$3, \$5, \$10, \$20, and \$30 Scratch tickets, with prizes ranging from a free \$1 ticket up to \$300,000 cash. A variety of Scratch games were developed and offered during the course of the year.

The Nebraska Lottery sells Lotto (online) games such as Lotto America®, Lucky for Life®, Powerball®, Mega Millions®, 2by2®, MyDaY®, Nebraska Pick 3®, and Nebraska Pick 5®. MyDaY, Nebraska Pick 5, and Nebraska Pick 3 are offered exclusively in Nebraska. Lotto America, Powerball, and 2by2 are operated on behalf of member lotteries by the Multi-State Lottery Association; and Lucky for Life and Mega Millions are operated by their member lotteries. Drawings for 2by2, Lucky for Life, and Nebraska-exclusive Lotto games are held every night. Lotto America and Powerball drawings are held three nights a week, and Mega Millions drawings are held twice per week. The price for a single play of most games is \$1, except for Lucky for Life and Powerball, which are \$2 per play, and Mega Millions, which is \$5 per play. Lotto prizes range from a free ticket up to a multimillion-dollar jackpot.

Nebraska Lottery Scratch and Lotto game products, equipment, and services are provided by Brightstar Lottery, formerly known as International Game Technology. Brightstar Lottery employs 40 people across Nebraska. Tickets and equipment are distributed from the Brightstar warehouse in Lincoln. The Nebraska Lottery contracts with Smith Kroeger of Omaha for advertising development and marketing-related services. Security and audit services are provided under contract with other Nebraska firms.

There are 22 Nebraska Lottery state employees providing accounting, marketing, communication, information technology, security, and general administrative services.

# **OPERATIONS**

### \$1 Billion Back to Nebraska

At the end of September 2024, the Nebraska Lottery announced a significant milestone in its 30-year history: transferring over \$1 billion in proceeds back to Nebraska since 1993.



"When you buy a Nebraska Lottery ticket, you're supporting good causes all across our state," said Brian Rockey, Nebraska Lottery Director. "Around 25 cents of every dollar spent on lottery products goes to support the environment, education, the Nebraska State Fair, and problem gambler's assistance. We are extremely proud of our record of making a difference in Nebraska along with our players and retailers. Together we're building a better Nebraska."

Projects supported with lottery proceeds include restoring habitat for wildlife, grants for Nebraska college students, improvements at the Nebraska State Fair, and help for Nebraskans dealing with gambling addiction. See the Beneficiary Support section of this report for additional information.

Promoting this achievement involved several marketing and communications efforts. A press release was developed with the beneficiary programs to highlight how Nebraska Lottery proceeds are Helping to Build a Better Nebraska<sup>®</sup>. A new logo with the tagline, \$1 Billion Back to Nebraska, was added to Lottery materials. And a beneficiary campaign with digital, television, and radio was created to promote that all 93 counties in Nebraska have benefited from Nebraska Lottery proceeds.

# **Mobile App Update**

A new version of the Nebraska Lottery mobile app was launched in April 2025. The app was developed by Appsky of Omaha using a modern platform that is more reliable and provides additional insights on app usage. Changes to the app can also be made more quickly than before.

Based on the data from the new platform, the average app session length is five minutes. The most-popular feature of the app is the Ticket Scanner, followed by the Winning Numbers page, and the MVP Club sign-in link. A total of 46,290 ePlayslips created in the mobile app were used to purchase Lotto tickets at retailers during the fiscal year.

# **Online Birthday Coupons**

One of the benefits to Nebraska Lottery players that opt-in to marketing communications is a free game coupon mailed to them during their birth month. In fiscal year 2024, the total cost to produce and send birthday mailings was over \$191,000. With postage costs expected to rise, the Lottery decided to start offering birthday coupons online in January 2025 via the MVP Club at nelottery.com.

Prior to the change, players in the Lottery's relationship marketing database that were receiving printed birthday coupons but were not MVP Club members were notified by email and encouraged to sign up for the MVP Club to continue receiving their birthday coupons. All MVP Club members were invited to update their contact information so they could be notified of new eCoupons via an Account Update Promotion between November 19 and December 9, 2024.



Birthday eCoupons started going out to players in January 2025. During the fiscal year, 89,510 birthday eCoupons were distributed. Redemption rates for these coupons averaged 4.8%, which is above the generally accepted response rate for direct marketing offers. In addition to cost savings, online coupons are faster to distribute and provide additional touchpoints for player interaction. Players that have not redeemed their birthday coupon after three months get a reminder email, which has increased redemption rates.

# **Responsible Gaming Activities**

The Nebraska Lottery continues to roll out responsible gaming initiatives for lottery players and staff. During March 2025 employee training was offered to lottery and vendor staff. The training covered warning signs of problem gambling, links to help resources, and a video with scenarios that lottery employees may encounter on the job. A total of 116 employees took the training, and the average post-training score on the final knowledge test score was 93.81 out of 100.

A Player Resources brochure was produced with information on problem gambling assistance, responsible play, and lottery scam prevention. This brochure is available at Nebraska Lottery retailers.

Research was also conducted on problem gambling topics following Problem Gambling Awareness Month in March 2025. Between April 10 – June 8, 2025, a total of 148 players took a survey as part of the Lottery's Continuous Feedback Mechanism system. Of those surveyed, 72% indicated that they would know where to get help if they, or someone they knew, had a gambling problem. And 41% of respondents said they had noticed the new "Know Your Limit" tagline on lottery materials.

# **Gaming Competitive Environment**

Nebraska Lottery sales continue to reflect the changing gaming environment in our state. Scratch sales for fiscal year 2025 decreased 9.47% compared to the previous fiscal year, a decrease that can be attributed in part to the continued expansion of cash devices. Many Nebraska Lottery retailers offer cash devices in addition to Nebraska Lottery games, and previous research has shown that 71% of lottery players surveyed that played cash devices and lottery games on the same day would spend less on lottery games.

In recent years around the country the retail community has sought ways to streamline operations. Nebraska is one of two of the 45 states with lotteries that do not offer vending. Legislative Bill 60, which advanced from committee and is pending debate in the 2026 legislative session, would eliminate this restriction.

The norms for buying and redeeming lottery tickets are also changing due to courier services. These convenience services charge a fee to maintain customer accounts for ticket purchases and redemptions. Couriers have no affiliation with the Nebraska Lottery and are not lottery retailers, but they work with lottery retailers to purchase tickets on behalf of players. The popularity of these services expanded during fiscal year 2025. The Jackpocket service started offering a limited selection of Nebraska Lottery Scratch tickets on their platform in March 2025. As a result, their retailer partner Winner's Corner was the second-largest Scratch retailer during the fiscal year, in addition to being the top Lotto retailer.


The Nebraska Lottery monitors retailers partnering with courier services closely and is developing new regulations on bulk ticket purchases. These regulations will provide safeguards to maintain the integrity of our games and make sure every player has the same chance of winning.

# **Mega Millions Game Enhancements**

Mega Millions got a "mega" overhaul in April 2025. Among the enhancements players benefit from:

- Bigger jackpots more frequently
- Faster growing jackpots
- A built-in multiplier on every play, automatically improving every non-jackpot prize by 2X, 3X, 4X, 5X or 10X up to \$10 million for matching the five white balls
- No breakeven prizes, meaning when a player wins, they'll always win more than the cost of a play



"We anticipate that the larger Mega Millions jackpots and new features will appeal to our players," said Brian Rockey, Nebraska Lottery Director. "The Mega Millions Consortium that sets the game rules does not include Nebraska, but under a licensing arrangement we've offered Mega Millions since 2010. It's produced several Nebraska millionaires along with millions in proceeds for good causes across our state."

As part of the game enhancements, the price of each Mega Millions play increased to \$5. Tickets for the enhanced game went on sale April 5, 2025.

# **Lotto Pack Specials**

The Nebraska Lottery has used terminal specials for some time to encourage trial of Lotto games. Most specials are tied to holidays such as St. Patrick's Day and offer a selection of Lotto tickets at a discounted price.

A \$10 special has been offered at events to encourage players to make the required purchase to spin the prize wheel. The first Lotto Pack Special was launched for all retailers on April 11, 2025. Players that asked for the special at any lottery retailer received one play of Lotto America with All Star Bonus, one play of Lucky for Life, and two plays each of Nebraska Pick 5, Nebraska Pick 3, MyDaY and 2by2 for \$10 (a \$2 discount).

A total of 3,605 Lotto Pack Specials were purchased April 11 - 20 at 679 retailers across the state. Many of the Lotto games included in the special had increased sales during the promotional period, especially the games with fixed top prizes. Based on these results, the Lotto Pack Special was repeated August 15 - 24, 2025.



# SCRATCH DEVELOPMENTS

Scratch ticket sales continued to slow compared to previous years. Sales for fiscal year 2025 were \$100,410,609, a decrease of 9.47% over the previous year. Lower sales of the \$2 Truck\$ & Buck\$ game can be attributed to a decrease in marketing as part of overall state government spending reductions.

# Unclaimed Truck\$ & Buck\$ Truck Given Away in Lucky Drive Promotion

Nebraska's most popular Scratch game, Truck\$ & Buck\$, encountered an unusual situation when one of the truck prizes from the 2023 game went unclaimed. The 2023 Truck\$ & Buck\$ game started the closing process on March 22, 2024. Players were encouraged to check their tickets and claim any prizes before the expiration date on September 18, 2024. However, the truck-winning ticket was never turned in.

This is the second time in Truck\$ & Buck\$ history that a truck has not been claimed. The 2010 Truck\$ & Buck\$ game also had an unclaimed truck prize.

The latest unclaimed truck was given away during the Lucky Drive promotion September 24 – October 12, 2024. Players purchased \$10 worth of Lucky for Life to get a voucher number to enter the contest through their MVP Club account. 16,709 vouchers were entered, and Beth Francis of Grand Island was drawn as the truck winner.

# **Lucky Star Games and Yuletide Ride Promotion**

The holidays were merry and bright with the Lucky Star family of Scratch games and the Yuletide Ride Second-Chance Promotion. \$1 Lucky Star 2X, \$5 Lucky Star 10X, and \$10 Lucky Star 20X went on sale October 14, 2024, and closed on January 24, 2025. An advertising campaign with Santa as a talk radio host giving advice on giving the perfect gift was used to promote the games.

Non-winning Lucky Star Scratch tickets could be entered online at nelottery.com in the Yuletide Ride Second-Chance Promotion for a chance to win a 2024 Ford Bronco<sup>®</sup>. Players loved the chance to win a new Bronco and entered 88,073 non-winning tickets in the contest, a 42% increase over the 2023 holiday second-chance promotion.

Patty Atherton of Lincoln was the lucky winner who drove away in the metallic green Ford Bronco on January 31, 2025. Atherton said she entered



78 tickets in what became sort of a weekly tradition. "My daughter was able to work from home when she was pregnant," she said. "I would go over on Wednesdays to take her lunch and bring five Scratch tickets for her and five for me." They both entered their non-winning tickets in the second-chance drawing and then sort of forgot about it, Atherton said.

When she got the call telling her she had won, she was confused at first.

"He said I won the Yuletide Ride contest and I forgot what the prize was," she said. "He told me I won a new Bronco and I said, 'You gotta be kidding me!"

### **MONOPOLY 10X®**

In 2025 players took a spin around the board and won big prizes with the \$5 MONOPOLY 10X® Scratch game and second-chance promotion. The MONOPOLY 10X Scratch game featured artwork from the famous board game and three \$50,000 top prizes. Non-winning tickets could be entered in the Monopoly Second-Chance Promotion for a chance to win one of 10 weekly \$1,000 cash prizes or the \$10,000 grand prize.



# **RETAILERS**

The Nebraska Lottery sells Scratch and Lotto tickets through a retailer network of approximately 1,200 locations statewide. Nebraska Lottery retailers range from convenience stores and truck stops to supermarkets. Nebraska Lottery tickets may not be sold in establishments licensed for the consumption of alcohol. Players must be at least 19 years old to purchase and redeem Nebraska Lottery tickets.

Previous research among retailers found that carrying Lottery tickets is viewed as a customer service by 62% of retailers responding. Another 36% of retailers said they believe Lottery tickets are both a customer service and a profit center for their stores.

During the fiscal year, the Lottery processed 74 new retailer applications and 42 retailer changes of ownership. The statewide sales leaders for the fiscal year are listed here.

# **BENEFICIARY SUPPORT**

The Nebraska Lottery transferred a total of \$45.7 million in lottery proceeds to its beneficiary funds between July 1, 2024, and June 30, 2025.

Amendment 4, passed by Nebraska voters in November 2004, established the following distribution formula:

- Education (44.5%), as directed by the Legislature;
- · Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund (44.5%);
- · Nebraska State Fair (10%); and
- Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund (1%), plus the first \$500,000 in fund proceeds each fiscal year.

# **Winner Anonymity**

Under Nebraska law, the name, hometown, and prize amount for winners of prizes less than \$250,000 is public information. Legislative Bill 1204 provided anonymity to prize winners of \$250,000 or more starting July 19, 2024. The identity of winners of prizes of \$250,000 or more cannot be publicly disclosed without written authorization from the winner. Ten prizes were claimed anonymously during the fiscal year.

We have audited the financial statements of the business-type activities of the Nebraska Department of Revenue, Lottery Division (Nebraska Lottery), as of and for the year ended June 30, 2025, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the Nebraska Lottery's basic financial statements as listed in the Table of Contents.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the business-type activities of the Nebraska Lottery, as of June 30, 2025, and the respective changes in financial position, and cash flows thereof for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS) and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Nebraska Lottery and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

### **Emphasis of Matter**

As discussed in Note 1, the financial statements of the Nebraska Lottery are intended to present the financial position and the changes in financial position of only that portion of the business activities of the State that is attributable to the transactions of the Nebraska Lottery. They do not purport to, and do not, present fairly the financial position of the State of Nebraska as of June 30, 2025, and the changes in its financial position, or its cash flows thereof, for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

### Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Nebraska Lottery's ability to continue as a going concern for 12 months beyond the financial statement date, including any currently known information that may raise substantial doubt shortly thereafter.

### Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and, therefore, is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS and *Government Auditing Standards* will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS and Government Auditing Standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Nebraska Lottery's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Nebraska Lottery's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

### Required Supplementary Information

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the Management's Discussion and Analysis, on pages 10-13 herein, be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

### **Other Information**

Management is responsible for the other information included in the annual report. The other information comprises the statistical section but does not include the basic financial statements and our auditor's report thereon. Our opinion on the basic financial statements does not cover the other information, and we do not express an opinion or any form of assurance thereon.

In connection with our audit of the basic financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and consider whether a material inconsistency exists between the other information and the basic financial statements, or the other information otherwise appears to be materially misstated. If, based on the work performed, we conclude that an uncorrected material misstatement of the other information exists, we are required to describe it in our report.

### Other Reporting Required by Government Auditing Standards

In accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, we have also issued our report dated September 30, 2025, on our consideration of the Nebraska Lottery's internal control over financial reporting and on our tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements and other matters. The purpose of that report is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over financial reporting and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of the Nebraska Lottery's internal control over financial reporting or on compliance. That report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* in considering the Nebraska Lottery's internal control over financial reporting and compliance.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

For the Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2025

### 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### A. Basis of Presentation

The accompanying basic financial statements of the Nebraska Department of Revenue, Lottery Division, (Nebraska Lottery) have been prepared in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP), as applied to governmental units. As the Nebraska Lottery is a business-type activity, the financial statements presented are the financial statements required by Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statement Number 34 for an enterprise fund. GASB is the accepted standard-setting body for establishing governmental accounting and financial reporting principles.

The basic financial statements have been prepared primarily from data maintained by the Nebraska Lottery on computer systems provided by the lottery-services vendor and from accounts maintained by the State Accounting Administrator of the Department of Administrative Services

### **B. Reporting Entity**

The Nebraska Lottery was created on February 24, 1993, by the Nebraska Legislature as a division of the Nebraska Department of Revenue (Department), established under and governed by the laws of the State of Nebraska. As such, the Nebraska Lottery is exempt from State and Federal income taxes. The financial statements include all funds of the Nebraska Lottery. The Nebraska Lottery is to provide an instant win and a random number selection on-line lottery. The net proceeds, as outlined in Neb. Rev. Stat. § 9-812 (Cum. Supp. 2024), are to be transferred to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund, the education funds pursuant to section 79-3501, the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, and the Nebraska State Fair Support and Improvement Cash Fund, a fund of the State Fair Board. The financial statements include only the Nebraska Lottery and are not intended to present the financial position of the Department or the results of operations and changes in net positions of the Department as a whole. The Department is part of the primary government for the State of Nebraska's reporting entity.

The Nebraska Lottery has also considered all potential component units for which it is financially accountable, including other organizations that are fiscally dependent on the Nebraska Lottery or whose relationship with the Nebraska Lottery is so significant that exclusion would be misleading or incomplete. GASB has set forth criteria to be considered in determining financial accountability. These criteria include appointing a voting majority of an organization's governing body, and (1) the ability of the Nebraska Lottery to impose its will on that organization, or (2) the potential for the organization to provide specific financial benefits to, or impose specific financial burdens on, the Nebraska Lottery. The Nebraska Lottery is also considered financially accountable if an organization is fiscally dependent on it, and there is potential for the organization to provide specific financial benefits to, or impose specific financial burdens on, the Nebraska Lottery, regardless of whether the organization has (1) a separately elected governing board, (2) a governing board appointed by a higher level of government, or (3) a jointly appointed board.

These financial statements present the Nebraska Lottery. No component units were identified. The Nebraska Lottery is part of the primary government for the State of Nebraska's reporting entity.

### C. Measurement Focus, Basis of Accounting

The accounting and financial reporting treatment applied to a fund is determined by its measurement focus and basis of accounting. Basis of accounting refers to when revenues and expenses are recognized in the accounts and reported in the financial statements. Basis of accounting relates to the timing of the measurements made, regardless of the measurement focus applied.

The Nebraska Lottery's financial statements were reported using the economic resources measurement focus and the accrual basis of accounting. With the economic resources measurement focus, all assets and all liabilities associated with the operations are included on the Statement of Net Position. Revenues are recorded when earned, and expenses are recorded when a liability is incurred, regardless of the timing of related cash flows. Net Position includes restricted and unrestricted resources. The Nebraska Lottery's operating statements present increases (e.g., revenues) and decreases (e.g., expenses) in net position.

It is the policy of the State to spend restricted resources only when unrestricted resources are insufficient or unavailable. When both restricted and unrestricted resources are available for use, it is the Nebraska Lottery's policy to use unrestricted resources first, then restricted resources, as they are needed.

Revenues generated from the sale of lottery tickets are reported as operating revenues. Transactions that are capital financing, non-capital financing, or investing related are reported as non-operating revenues. All expenses related to operating the Nebraska Lottery are reported as operating expenses. All other expenses are reported as non-operating expenses.

Instant ticket revenue is recognized when tickets are sold to the retailer, and on-line revenue is recognized after the drawing is completed for the respective wagers. A 5.0% - 6.0% retailer commission and a prize expense are recognized at the same time. Revenues from the sale of on-line tickets for future drawings and the related agent commission and prize expense are deferred until the drawings are held.

Prize expense is recognized in the same period ticket revenue is recognized based on the predetermined prize structure for each game. Because the instant prize-winning tickets are randomly distributed throughout the tickets, and some winning tickets will be lost, destroyed, or unredeemed for other reasons, there will be differences between amounts accrued and the amounts actually paid. These differences, denoted as unclaimed prizes, are recognized as a reduction of prize expense 181 days after the close of each instant game and 181 days after each draw for on-line games, as prizes unclaimed for 180 days expire. Unclaimed prizes for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025, totaled \$3,859,293.

The activities of the Nebraska Lottery are accounted for as an enterprise fund. Enterprise funds are used to account for governmental operations that are financed and operated in a manner similar to private business enterprises and where the governing body has decided that periodic determination of revenues earned, expenses incurred, and net position is appropriate.

### **D. Cash and Cash Equivalents**

In addition to bank accounts and petty cash, this classification includes all short-term investments, such as certificates of deposit, repurchase agreements, and U.S. treasury bills. These short-term investments may have original maturities (remaining time to maturity at acquisition) greater than three months; however, cash is available and is considered cash and cash equivalents for reporting purposes. These investments are stated at cost, which at June 30, 2025, approximates market. Banks pledge collateral, as required by law, to guarantee State funds held in time and demand deposits.

Cash and cash equivalents are under the control of the State Treasurer or other administrative bodies, as determined by law. All cash deposited with the State Treasurer is initially maintained in a pooled cash account. On a daily basis, the State Treasurer invests cash not needed for current operations with the State's Investment Council, which maintains an operating investment pool for such investments. Interest earned on these investments is allocated to funds based on their percentage of the investment pool.

### **E. Budgetary Process**

The State's biennial budget cycle ends on June 30 of the odd-numbered years. By September 15, prior to a biennium, the Nebraska Lottery and all other State agencies must submit their budget requests for the biennium beginning the following July 1. The requests are submitted on forms that show estimated funding requirements by programs, sub-programs, and activities. The Executive Branch reviews the requests, establishes priorities, and balances the budget within the estimated resources available during the upcoming biennium.

The Governor's budget bill is submitted to the Legislature in January. The Legislature considers revisions to the bill and presents the appropriations bill to the Governor for signature. The Governor may: a) approve the appropriations bill in its entirety; b) veto the bill; or c) line-item veto certain sections of the bill. Any vetoed bill or line item can be overridden by a three-fifths vote of the Legislature.

The approved appropriations will generally set spending limits for a particular program within the agency. Within the agency or program, the Legislature may provide funding from one to five budgetary fund types. Thus, the control is by fund type, within a program, within an agency.

Appropriations are usually made for each year of the biennium, with unexpended balances being reappropriated at the end of the first year of the biennium. For most appropriations, balances lapse at the end of the biennium.

All State budgetary expenditures for the enterprise fund type are made pursuant to the appropriations, which may be amended by the Legislature, upon approval by the Governor. State agencies may reallocate the appropriations between major objects of expenditure accounts, except that the Legislature's approval is required to exceed the personal service limitations contained in the appropriations bill. Increases in total appropriations must also be approved by the Legislature as a deficit appropriations bill.

Revenues are not budgeted.

### F. Receivables

Receivables are reported net of estimated allowances for uncollectible amounts, which are estimated based upon past collection experience and current economic conditions.

### **G. Capital Assets**

Capital assets include equipment that is valued at cost when historical records are available and at estimated historical cost when no historical records exist. Donated capital assets are valued at their estimated fair market value on the date received. Generally, equipment that has a cost in excess of \$5,000 at the date of acquisition and has an expected useful life of more than one year is capitalized. Computers are an exception to this policy and are capitalized if they have a cost in excess of \$1,500 and a useful life of more than one year.

Equipment is depreciated using the straight-line method over the estimated useful life of three to seven years.

### H. Leases

The Lottery determines if an arrangement is a lease at inception. Long-term leases are included in Right-to-Use (RTU) Assets and RTU Lease Liabilities on the Statement of Net Position. RTU assets represent the Lottery's right to use an underlying asset for the lease term, and lease liabilities represent the Lottery's obligation to make lease payments. RTU assets and liabilities are recognized at the present value of lease payments over the lease term. The Lottery has elected to recognize payments for short-term leases, those with a lease term of 12 months or less, as an expense as incurred. These leases are not included as right to use assets or lease liabilities. The RTU assets are amortized over the shorter of the lease term or the underlying asset useful life.

### I. Compensated Absences

All permanent employees working for the Nebraska Lottery earn sick and annual leave and are allowed to accumulate compensatory leave rather than being paid overtime. Temporary and intermittent employees are not eligible for paid leave. The liability has been calculated using the vesting method, in which leave amounts, for both employees currently eligible to receive termination payments and other employees expected to become eligible in the future to receive such payments upon termination, are included.

Nebraska Lottery employees accrue vested annual leave at a variable rate based on years of service. Generally, accrued annual leave cannot exceed 35 days at the end of a calendar year.

Employees accrue sick leave at a variable rate based on years of service. In general, accrued sick leave cannot exceed 180 days. There is no maximum limit on the accumulation of sick leave days for employees under certain labor contracts. Sick leave is not vested except upon either death or reaching the retirement eligibility age of 55, at which time the State is liable for 25 percent of the employee's accumulated sick leave. Employees under certain labor contracts can only be paid a maximum of 60 days.

The Nebraska Lottery's financial statements recognize the expense and accrued liability when vacation and compensatory leave is earned. Sick leave is accrued when it is earned and expected to be paid as termination payment or to be used.

### J. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at June 30, 2025, and revenues and expenditures during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

### 2. DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS

Investment of all available cash is made by the State Investment Officer on a daily basis, based on total bank balances. These funds are held in the State of Nebraska Operating Investment Pool (OIP), an internal investment pool. Additional information on the deposits and investments portfolio, including investment policies, risks, and types of investments, can be found in the State of Nebraska's Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR).

### 3. CONTINGENCIES AND COMMITMENTS

**Risk Management.** The Nebraska Lottery is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts, theft of, damage to, or destruction of assets, errors or omissions, injuries to employees, and natural disasters. The Nebraska Lottery, as part of the primary government for the State, participates in the State's risk management program. The Nebraska Department of Administrative Services is responsible for maintaining the insurance and self-insurance programs for the State. The State generally self-insures for general liability, motor vehicle liability and physical damage, employee health care, employee indemnification, and workers' compensation. The State has chosen to purchase insurance for:

- A. Life insurance for eligible employees.
- B. Crime coverage, with a limit of \$11,000,000 per occurrence and a deductible of \$1,000,000 per occurrence subject to specific conditions, limits, and exclusions.
- C. Real and personal property on a blanket basis for losses up to \$200,000,000, with an all other perils deductible of \$1,000,000 per loss occurrence. Newly acquired properties are covered up to \$10 million for 90 days. If not reported after 90 days, the property is covered for \$5 million under the miscellaneous unnamed location coverage. There is a wind and hail limit on the real and personal property of \$96,250,000. This coverage does not apply ground up. The perils of flood, earthquake, and acts of terrorism have various coverage, sub-limits, and self-insurance. State agencies have the option to purchase building contents and inland marine coverage.

Details of the various insurance coverages are available from the Nebraska Department of Administrative Services – Risk Management Division.

In calendar year 2024, one settlement of \$7,450,00 exceeded insurance coverage by \$2,050,000. No other claims have exceeded coverage in the last three years. Workers' compensation is funded in the Workers' Compensation Internal Service Fund through assessments on each agency based on total agency payroll and past experience. Tort claims, theft of, damage to, or destruction of assets, errors or omissions, and natural disasters would be funded through the State General Fund or by individual agency assessments, as directed by the Legislature, unless covered by purchased insurance. No amounts for estimated claims have been reported in the Nebraska Lottery's financial statements. Health care insurance is funded in the Insurance Trust Funds through a combination of employee and State contributions.

**Litigation.** The potential amount of liability involved in litigation pending against the Nebraska Lottery, if any, could not be determined at this time. However, it is the Nebraska Lottery's opinion that final settlement of those matters should not have an adverse effect on the Nebraska Lottery's ability to administer current programs. Any judgment against the Nebraska Lottery would have to be processed through the State Claims Board and be approved by the Legislature.

### 4. STATE EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT PLAN (PLAN)

The single-employer Plan became effective by statute on January 1, 1964. The Plan consists of a defined contribution option and a cash balance benefit and is administered by the Nebraska Public Employees Retirement Systems. The cash balance benefit is a type of defined benefit plan. Each member employed and participating in the retirement system prior to January 1, 2003, elected either to continue participation in the defined contribution option or to begin participation in the cash balance benefit. The defined contribution option is closed to new entrants. All new members of the Plan on and after January 1, 2003, become members of the cash balance benefit. The benefits and funding policy of the Plan is established and can only be amended by the Nebraska Legislature.

All permanent full-time employees are required to begin participation in the retirement system upon employment. All permanent part-time employees, who have attained the age of 18 years, may exercise the option to begin participation in the retirement system.

**Contribution.** Per statute, each member contributes 4.8% of his or her monthly compensation. The Nebraska Lottery matches the member's contribution at a rate of 156%. The employee's and employer's contributions are kept in separate accounts.

The employee's account is fully vested. The employer's account is fully vested after a total of three years of participation in the system, including credit for participation in another Nebraska governmental plan prior to actual contribution to the Plan.

**Defined Contribution Option.** Upon attainment of age 55, regardless of service, the retirement allowance is to be equal to the sum of the employee and employer accounts. Members have several forms of payment available, including withdrawals, deferrals, annuities, or a combination of these.

**Cash Balance Benefit.** Upon attainment of age 55, regardless of service, the retirement allowance shall be equal to the accumulated employee and employer cash balance accounts, including interest credits, annuitized for payment in the normal form. The normal form of payment is single life annuity with five-year certain, payable monthly. Members have the option to convert their member cash balance account to a monthly annuity with built in cost-of-living adjustments of 2.5% annually. Also available are additional forms of payment allowed under the State Plan that are actuarially equivalent to the normal form, including the option of lump-sum or partial lump-sum.

For the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025, employees contributed \$79,096, and the Nebraska Lottery contributed \$123,390. A separate plan report is issued by and can be obtained from the Nebraska Public Employees Retirement Systems. This report contains full pension-related disclosures.

The State of Nebraska Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR) also includes pension-related disclosures. The ACFR report is available from the Nebraska Department of Administrative Services – Accounting Division or on the Nebraska Auditor of Public Accounts' website at auditors.nebraska.gov.

### **5. RECEIVABLES**

Retailers comprised principally of grocery stores, convenience stores, and off-sale liquor stores serve as the primary distribution channel for lottery sales to the general public. Retailers must pay for instant lottery tickets 45 days after activation or when the pack is 70% validated, whichever comes first. Retailers pay for on-line tickets each Wednesday for balances due through the previous Saturday. The retailers' accounts receivable is net of allowance for uncollectible in the amount of \$101,987.

The Nebraska Lottery is a member of the Multi-State Lottery Association (MUSL), which operates games on behalf of participating state lotteries. Each MUSL member sells on-line game tickets through its agents and makes weekly payments to MUSL in an amount equal to each game's prize structure, less amounts retained for prizes paid directly to the winners by each member lottery. MUSL maintains prize reserve funds on some of the games to serve as a contingency reserve to protect from unforeseen prize liabilities. The money in these reserve funds is to be used at the discretion of the MUSL Board of Directors. The prize reserve funds are refundable to MUSL members if MUSL disbands or if a member leaves MUSL. Members leaving MUSL must wait at least one year before receiving their remaining share of the prize reserve funds.

In addition, the Nebraska Lottery has \$1,082,153 held by MUSL, reported on the Statement of Net Position as Reserves on Deposit (Current), which can be used to pay the Nebraska Lottery's portion of MUSL's operating budget, any MUSL legal expenses, and other expenses incurred by MUSL. These funds are not tied directly to any MUSL game.

The Powerball and Mega Millions grand prizes can be paid either as annual installments or as a lump sum cash payment, depending on the selection of the winner when claiming the prize. If the winner selects annual installments, MUSL purchases bonds, which are held in trust to fund the future installments. Maturities are staggered in order to provide adequate cash flow for each installment. MUSL is responsible for paying amounts owed to the grand prize winners. The assets and related liabilities are reflected in MUSL's financial statements and, therefore, are not reflected in the Nebraska Lottery's financial statements.

The Lucky for Life top two prize levels can be paid either through annuity payments for the life of the winner or as a lump sum cash payment, depending on the selection of the winner when claiming the prize. If a Nebraska winner selects the annuity, the Nebraska Lottery has a contract with MUSL so that MUSL will secure bids from financial services companies to provide the annual payments directly to the winner. Each participating jurisdiction contributes a proportionate share to fund the annuity or lump sum payment. During this fiscal year, there were two second-tier winners. There were no annuities as both the winners chose the cash option.

### 9. SIGNIFICANT COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS

Article III, § 24, of the Nebraska Constitution sets out the basic requirements for the transfer of lottery proceeds to certain beneficiary funds, specifying that a portion of those revenues are to "be used for education as the Legislature may direct[.]"

Neb. Rev. Stat. § 9-812(2) (Cum. Supp. 2024) offers the following legislative directive for the transfer of lottery proceeds:

A portion of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold on an annualized basis shall be transferred from the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund as provided in subsection (3) of this section. The dollar amount transferred pursuant to this subsection shall equal the greater of (a) the dollar amount transferred in fiscal year 2002-03 or (b) any amount which constitutes at least twenty-two percent and no more than twenty-five percent of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold on an annualized basis. To the extent that funds are available, the Tax Commissioner and director may authorize a transfer exceeding twenty-five percent of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets sold on an annualized basis.

Additionally, § 9-812(3) provides these further instructions:

Of the money available to be transferred as provided in this subsection:

- (a) The first five hundred thousand dollars shall be transferred to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used as provided in section 9-1006;
- (b) Forty-four and one-half percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be used for education and transferred pursuant to section 79-3501;
- (c) Forty-four and one-half percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund to be used as provided in the Nebraska Environmental Trust Act;
- (d) Ten percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Nebraska State Fair Board if the most populous city within the county in which the fair is located provides matching funds equivalent to ten percent of the funds available for transfer. Such matching funds may be obtained from the city and any other private or public entity, except that no portion of such matching funds shall be provided by the state. If the Nebraska State Fair ceases operations, ten percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the General Fund; and
- (e) One percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used as provided in section 9-1006.

Neb. Rev. Stat. § 79-3501(2) (Reissue 2024) states:

For fiscal years 2024-25 through 2028-29, the money available to be used for education pursuant to subdivision (3)(b) of section 9-812 shall be transferred as follows:

- (a) Eight percent to the Behavioral Training Cash Fund;
- (b) Two percent to the College Pathway Program Cash Fund;
- (c) Seven percent to the Community College Gap Assistance Program Fund;
- (d) Ten percent to the State Department of Education Improvement Grant Fund;
- (e) Three percent to fund distance education incentives pursuant to section 79-1337;
- (f) One percent to the Door to College Scholarship Fund;
- (g) Eight percent to the Excellence in Teaching Cash Fund;
- (h) One and one-half percent to the Expanded Learning Opportunity Grant Fund;
- (i) One and one-half percent to the Mental Health Training Cash Fund; and
- (j) Fifty-eight percent to the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund.

As required under its enabling legislation, transfers of \$45,698,589 were made to other funds during the fiscal year.

The Nebraska Lottery develops game structures to comply with the minimum prize provision of its enabling legislation, which requires a minimum of 40 percent to be paid in prizes.

The Nebraska Lottery compares the social security number of each winner who has a per-wager prize in excess of \$500 against a list of social security numbers having an outstanding State tax liability or delinquent child support payments. Any delinquent payments are withheld from winnings and forwarded to the appropriate State agency. During the fiscal year, the Nebraska Lottery collected \$26,052 in delinquent State taxes and \$54,725 in delinquent child support payments.

Operating Transfers In/Out will not balance, and Due To/From Other Funds will not balance, within the Nebraska Lottery's financial statements, as the Nebraska Lottery represents only part of the State's primary government.

### **10. UNRESTRICTED NET POSITION**

The Nebraska Lottery's unrestricted net position represents funds not legally restricted for any specific purpose; however, the funds may be used only to fund additional prize pay-outs, transfers to the beneficiary funds, or additional operating expenses of the Nebraska Lottery. Management's intention is to use the unrestricted net position to fund additional prize pay-outs, retailer incentives, and other game enhancements.

### 11. LEASES

The Nebraska Lottery leases office space at 137 NW 17th Street in Lincoln, Nebraska. The current lease contains extensions that can be exercised providing the opportunity to go through June 2037. As of June 30, 2025, the value of the Right to Use Lease Asset was \$1,211,941, and the related accumulated amortization was \$300,116. The lease arrangement requires payments for utility and janitorial services that are excluded from the lease liability calculation as non-lease components. Below is the principal and interest payment disclosure requirement for this lease.
