- LB 878 *(Guereca)* Require paid maternity leave for state employees
- LB 958 *(Cavanaugh, M.)* Provide duties for the Department of Health and Human Services relating to 1915(c) waivers, retroactive coverage, and community engagement reporting requirements under the Medical Assistance Act
- LB 958A *(Cavanaugh, M.)* Appropriation Bill
- LB 762 *(Dungan)* Require insurance coverage of pediatric autoimmune disorders
- LB 1187 *(DeKay)* Change certain fees and surcharges, membership of the Nebraska Brand Committee, brand inspection requirements, satisfactory evidence of ownership, and registered feedlots under the Livestock Brand Act and provide for an executive director, backgrounding lots, and registered dairy heifer development facilities
- LB 966 *(Cavanaugh, M.)* Adopt the Hunger-Free Schools Act
- LB 929 *(Fredrickson)* Provide for managed care organizations to pay the deductible, cost sharing, or similar charges on behalf of medicaid enrollees
- LB 962 *(McKinney)* Adopt the Youth Reentry and Transitional Support Act

- LB 965 *(Bostar)* Prohibit sexual abuse of a probationer or problem solving court participant and sexual abuse by a conservator, guardian, guardian ad litem, or child welfare service provider; change provisions relating to protection orders, certain offenses, attorney's fees, and victim notification requirements; and provide requirements for immunity for probation employees, Brady-Giglio lists, confidentiality for certain officers, registration under the Sex Offender Registration Act, county conflict counsel, and determinations of the best interest of the child

LB 1022 (*Murman*) Eliminate the human relations training requirement for obtaining certificates and permits for teaching, providing special services, or education administration

FINAL READING: CONSENT CALENDAR (Bills Preceded with an * Will Require a Vote To Suspend At Large Reading, Pursuant to Rule 6, Section 8)

The following rules apply to Consent Calendar:

- 1) If any five members of the Legislature object to the bill being considered on Consent Calendar, please advise the Clerk in writing. Such requests must be filed with the Clerk prior to the reading of the bill, at this stage of consideration, on the bill to be removed.
- 2) Upon either the completion of debate or the expiration of 15 minutes, whichever comes first, a vote shall be taken to advance the bill and on any pending motions or amendments pursuant to Rule 5, Section 6(d).
- 3) Any amendment adopted, other than the standing committee amendment, which adds new subject matter to the bill will result in the bill not being scheduled at the next stage of debate.

LB 753 (*Rountree*) Provide for recognition and enforcement of military protective orders under the Protection Orders Act

* LB 784 (*Hallstrom*) Change residency requirements for sheriffs in certain counties, requirements for uniforms for sheriffs and deputies, and continuing education requirements for law enforcement officers

LB 788 (*Bosn*) Change the administrator of the Financial Fraud Victims' Reimbursement Fund from the Attorney General to the Nebraska State Patrol

LB 913 (*Guereca*) Require the Department of Health and Human Services to appoint a dementia services coordinator

* LB 977 (*Storer*) Provide requirements under the Nebraska Rules of the Road for motorists and electric personal assistive mobility device operators encountering certain animals being led, herded, or driven on or along highways

LB 1055 (*DeBoer*) Provide training requirements for an adult protective services official under the Adult Protective Services Act

LB 1195 (*Storer*) Change requirements relating to female inmates of county jails and require county and city jails to comply with standards regarding cross-gender supervision and searches of inmates

LB 429 (*Murman*) Provide requirements and restrictions for school boards relating to professional employees' organizations

LB 721 (*Quick*) Change provisions relating to eligibility for grants under the Intergenerational Care Facility Incentive Grant Program

LB 722 (*Quick*) Provide for use of the Behavioral Health Services Fund for individuals with substance use disorder

LB 727 (*Kauth*) Authorize law enforcement agencies to obtain, maintain, and possess epinephrine autoinjectors and nasal epinephrine for use by a law enforcement officer and require training

* LB 743 (*Juarez*) Change provisions relating to optional benefit forms under the Police Officers Retirement Act

LB 745 (*Juarez*) Change provisions relating to the requirements for a diploma of high school equivalency

* LB 748 (*Sorrentino*) Change provisions relating to the Nebraska educational savings plan trust and allow for the use of trust funds for recognized postsecondary credential programs

LB 749 (*Sorrentino*) Change provisions relating to the calculation of tax levies for state aid to municipalities

- * LB 758 *(von Gillern)* Change provisions relating to nontestamentary transfers on death, and evidence of ownership to obtain a certificate of title and provide a method for a beneficiary charitable organization to receive property or information
- * LB 768 *(Dover)* Provide powers for the Nebraska Investment Finance Authority and change provisions relating to the Nebraska Affordable Housing Act, the Rural Workforce Housing Investment Act, and the Middle Income Workforce Housing Investment Act
- LB 778 *(Dungan)* Change grant eligibility provisions under the Civic and Community Center Financing Act
- * LB 787 *(Sanders)* Change provisions relating to the Commission on Military and Veterans Affairs and eliminate provisions relating to veterans homes
- * LB 797 *(Urban Affairs Committee)* Increase minimum bidding amount requirements for certain cities and villages
- * LB 798 *(Urban Affairs Committee)* Change provisions relating to the composition of the planning commission of a city of the second class or village and allow a city of the second class to elect council members by ward
- * LB 822 *(Nebraska Retirement Systems Committee)* Rename the Police Officers Retirement Act as the Cities of the First Class Police Officers Retirement Act and change provisions of such act
