Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB1005 allows the operation of ATV and utility-type vehicles between sunset and sunrise within the corporate limits of a city, village, or unincorporated village under certain conditions. For multiple beam headlights, the uppermost beam must sufficiently illuminate a person, vehicle, or object at a distance of at least one hundred feet in front of the vehicle and the lowermost beam must illuminate them at a distance of at least fifty feet in front of the vehicle. For single beam headlights, the headlight must illuminate a person, vehicle, or object at a distance of a least one hundred feet in front of the vehicle and the high intensity portion of the light must not project higher than the level of the center of the headlight. ATV and utility-type vehicles must also have a rear, red taillight that is plainly visible from a distance of five hundred feet behind the vehicle.
