Summary of purpose and/or changes:

This bill proposes amending Neb. Rev. Stat. § 77-1311.03 to provide that county assessors performing their official duties are not liable for prosecution for trespass. There is an exception to this grant of immunity in cases where the county assessor enters an enclosed building without the express permission of the property owner or occupant.

Explanation of amendments:

The amendment makes the immunity against criminal prosecution for trespassing contingent on either (1) prior written notice to the parcel owner or (2) advance newspaper notice.
