Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 102 changes the ADC standard of need provisions. Specifically, standard of need provisions are changed regarding eligibility, amounts, adjustments, and calculation of benefit amount.

Sec. 1: The standard of need represents the regular recurring monthly amount necessary for basic subsistence and is part of the initial income test in determining eligibility for ADC benefits using the Budget the Gap Methodology.

Effective July 1, 2026, the standard of need for a single individual shall be \$1,132,50 plus \$390 for each additional

Effective July 1, 2026, the standard of need for a single individual shall be \$1,132.50 plus \$390 for each additional individual in the ADC unit.

The standard of need for ADC payments shall be adjusted on July 1 of every year, instead of every second year,

beginning July 1, 2026 (changed from 1997). The adjustment shall be made on the basis of the rate of growth as determined by the U.S. Department of Labor for the previous calendar year, not the two past calendar years.
