Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB207 obligates operators of alternative fuel motor vehicles weighing more than seven thousand five hundred pounds to pay a higher fee to the Department of Motor Vehicles, which varies depending on weight. Section 60-306 defines alternative fuel as electricity, solar power, or any other source of energy not otherwise taxed under the motor fuel laws in the state.

Explanation of amendments:

The Committee considered and adopted an amendment which accomplishes the following:

Excludes vehicles registered under section 60-3,198 from the higher fees. Section apportionable vehicles registered with the Division of Motor Carrier Services of the DMV	
Section 1 - Amends section 60-3,191 - Alternative fuel; fees Commercially registered alternative fuel vehicles weighing more than seven thousand fi hundred pounds must pay three times the applicable fee for other alternative fuel vehicle at the present time would one hundred fifty dollars.	
Vehicles other than commercially registered alternative vehicles, alternative vehicle motorcycles, or plug-in hybrid electric vehicles must pay a fee of one hundred fifty dollars.	
Section 2 - Repeals original section 60-3,191.
