## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 265 would amend Neb. Rev. Stat. § 79-873.

Currently, labor organizations representing public school employees and employers can place restrictions upon when a public school employee can join or leave such an organization. The Bill would prevent the organization from being able to place these restrictions into any new or renewed membership contracts.

Section-by-Section Summary:

Section 1: States that a labor organization representing public school employees or their employers shall not place any restriction on a public school employee from joining or terminating membership in a labor organization. That restriction would be placed upon any membership contract that was entered into or renewed after this bill is made effective.

Section 2: Neb. Rev. Stat. § 79-872 allows for teachers and administrators who voluntarily participates in professional or labor organizations to have the school district deduct their dues to the organizations form their paychecks. Neb. Rev. Stat. § 79-873 requires this deduction be authorized in writing and binds the employee, the school district, and the organization. The bill would modify this binding to be in accordance with Section 1.

Section 3: Repeals the original sections being amended.

Section 4: Since Section 1 declares an emergency, the Act takes effect when it is passed.
