Summary of purpose and/or changes:

This bill proposes changes to a section of the Uniform Deceptive Trade Practices Act. It would prohibit receipt of compensation for "preparing, presenting, prosecuting, advising, consulting, or assisting any individual" in relation to any veterans benefits matter. Compensation for referrals would also be prohibited. This section would not prohibit fee-sharing between attorneys as allowed under Nebraska law and the Nebraska Rules of Professional Conduct. All restrictions in this section would apply only to those whose conduct is not permitted by federal law. Violation of the provisions of this section would constitute a deceptive trade practice under the Uniform Deceptive Trade Practices Act. County veterans service officers are expressly exempted from the bill.

Explanation of amendments:

The amendment adds state veteran service officers to the exemption already provided for county VSOs.
