Summary of purpose and/or changes:

This bill would require the State Patrol to conduct a study to determine how to increase state criminal justice protective and investigative resources for reporting and identifying missing Black women and children. An electronic report shall be submitted by the Nebraska State Patrol to the Executive Board of the Legislative Council by June 1, 2027. The Nebraska State Patrol shall work with the Commission on African American Affairs and the United States Department of Justice to conduct the study.
