Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 813 was introduced by Senator Bostar. It would amend Neb. Rev. Stat. § 48-604, also known as the Employment Security Law.

LB 813 would allow marketplace network contractors to have physical locations in the state of Nebraska and not lose their ability to have the marketplace network contractor be considered independent contractors even if they perform services at that physical location.

Currently, LB 813 would likely only apply to one identified business: DoorDash. DoorDash wants to bring DashMarts to the state of Nebraska. DashMarts are grocery stores that only users of DoorDash have access to. The app allows customers to buy a limit selection of items, mostly staple goods, from their stores and have drivers then be sent to those stores to get the selected items. It is likely that driers would spend only a small amount of time inside the



DashMarts as they are likely to only be in the stores when they are picking up the orders.

DashMarts do have typical employees that operate inside the building to package products and keep the grocery store stocked. These employees would still be considered employees and DoorDash would still be required to provide benefits to them.
