**Summary of purpose and/or changes:**

LB 827, introduced by Senator DeKay, amends Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 2-3232 to provide for the creation of or participation in soil and water programs for public education by natural resources districts (NRDs) throughout the state.

Established in 1972, NRDs are local governmental units involved in a variety of projects and programs to conserve and protect the state's natural resources. There are 23 NRDs in Nebraska. The boundaries are organized based on Nebraska's major river basins, which allows for better management practices to be applied to similar topography.

LB827 adds new subsection (3) to section 2-3232 to authorize any of the NRDs in the state to establish or participate in programs to educate agricultural producers and the general public about research practices to improve water quality, water quantity management or soil health practices. Such programs may include conducting demonstration projects and hosting educational events. The districts may enter into agreements with various other public or private or state



or federal entities to establish or participate in such programs.
