This bill permits, and in some instances requires, the Department of Health and Human Services to grant limited licenses (three years) to qualifying internationally trained physicians. The bill grants eligibility for an unrestricted license to such physicians after the three years. The bill as amended has an operative date of August 1, 2027.

The cost to implement two new license types is \$20,000 from the Professional and Occupational Licensing Fund. The cost would be recouped by fees, which are not established in the bill, but could be established administratively by the agency. DHHS notes current physicians licensure fees are \$300 for initial and \$121 for subsequent biannual renewal. Because the fees are not explicit in the bill and there is no approximation of the number of newly qualifying internationally trained physicians, the estimate of revenue is indeterminable.
