LB163 creates the Office of Climate Action (OCA) within the Department of Environment and Energy (DEE). LB163 states OCA shall employ personnel.

LB163 requires OCA to create a climate action plan by July 1, 2026 and describes the actions entailed. The bill requires OCA to file on or before July 1 of each year a report with the Clerk of the Legislature and details the report contents.

No basis to disagree with the Department of Environment and Energy based on the assumptions provided.

DAS submitted a request for revolving fund appropriation based upon ten employees, DEE submitted a request for six employees. Our office has adjusted the revolving fund appropriation request accordingly.

Explanation of Estimate:

LB 163 creates a new "Office of Climate Action" within the Department of Environment and Energy.

If any office space changes would be required, DAS State Building Division (SBD) will need to manage such requests and would request additional revolving fund spending authority to provide space to accommodate any potential changes and/or expansions. The current rent estimate per person is between \$4,800 to \$5,400. There would also be a one-time cost for furniture, fixtures, and equipment (FFE) of about \$8,000 per person.

This could also incur one-time and on-going services from the DAS Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO). The space(s) may require one-time network setup costs estimated at \$815 plus monthly services for additional phone, computer lease, and other technology services estimated at \$254 per month. DAS-OCIO would request additional revolving fund spending authority to provide these one-time and on-going services.

DAS-SBD and OCIO would request an increase in revolving fund appropriate that is sufficient to cover the additional operational costs as a result of LB 163. Annually, low estimates per employee would be \$15,848 and high estimates would be \$17,263. Should the newly established Office require ten employees, DAS averaged the high and low estimates to determine approximate annual revolving fund appropriation requests combined for SBD and OCIO to be \$165,555 the first year (includes the one-time costs), and \$85,555 in the following years.

The Department of Environment and Energy would be billed for the services provided.

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Explanation of Estimate:

LB163 creates the Office of Climate Action within NDEE. The legislation is broad as climate action means any effort to combat climate change and its effects. LB163 requires the Office of Climate Action to employ personnel to fulfill the duties of the office including creating a climate action plan, create policies that support climate action, work with interested stakeholders, political subdivisions, and organizations supporting climate action across the state, provide technical support, and file an annual report that details several items. The personnel needed to support this highly depends on the interest and technical support requested throughout the state, which is unknown. NDEE estimates it could take six staff to adequately implement the Office of Climate Action.

There is no appropriation associated with LB163 so additional funds would be necessary to create an Office of Climate Action.
