LB 308 is the Health Care Staffing Agency Registration Act.

Section 2 provides definitions for the act.

Under LB 308, a health care staffing agency shall register annually with the Department of Labor (DOL). Applicants shall certify that the agency will not enforce any noncompete clause in any contract existing prior to registration with any health care entity or staff worker restricting any manner of employment opportunities of a staff worker. An annual registration fee of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) shall be paid to DOL.

LB 308 does not create, nor does it identify, a cash fund to receive such fees and make expenditures to administer the program. In absence of such language, it is assumed that the costs to run the program and any fees collected will be borne by the General Fund.

Section 4 requires health care staffing agencies to comply with certain requirements such: as documenting that each staff worker meets the minimum licensing, certification, and health requirements as are applicable, and maintaining a record for each staff worker and provide any required documentation to external parties or regulators, and reporting requirements to DOL.

Section 7 requires DOL to establish a system for the public to report complaints which shall be investigated by DOL.

Section 8 requires DOL to create a database of health care staffing agencies registered under the Act. DOL shall make the database accessible to the public on the DOL website.

Section 11 provides an operative date of January 1, 2026.

The Department of Labor estimates the need for 3.13 FTE in fiscal year 2026 as the program starts up. This number rises to 4.39 in fiscal year 2027, when a full fiscal year of costs will be realized. The cost for hearings is estimated to be \$90,000 per year, based on an assumed 15 hearings taking 40 hours each, multiplied by \$150 per hour. IT costs are estimated at \$442,672 for the initial bid and \$103,080 per year for annual maintenance costs. There is no basis to disagree with these estimates.

Explanation of Estimate:

LB308 creates the Health Care Staffing Agency Registration Act. The Nebraska Department of Labor (NDOL) is responsible for the administration of the Act. LB308 requires NDOL to create and maintain a registration for all health care staffing agencies doing business in Nebraska. Health care staffing agencies are required to register with NDOL on an annual basis. Further, Section 4 requires health care staffing agencies to report additional information on a quarterly basis to NDOL. Section 7 requires NDOL to establish a system to receive complaints and gives the Commissioner of Labor authority to investigate alleged violations of the Act, issue citations, and revoke registrations. The Commissioner of Labor may designate an attorney to represent him or her in civil actions to enforce the Act.

As defined in LB308, NDOL estimates 536 employers currently doing business in Nebraska will be required to register under the Act. Registration fees are \$1,500 per year for \$804,000 per year in revenue, which will be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the General Fund. LB308 includes an operative date of January 1, 2026, which provides six months of impact during the first state fiscal year.

To administer the program, NDOL will need 1 Administrative Technician and 2 Labor Law Specialists. Additionally, NDOL will use contract hearing officers for conducting appeals. NDOL estimates 15 hearings per year. Each hearing will take approximately 40 hours of work from the hearing officer at a rate of \$150 per hour for a total of \$90,000 per year.

NDOL will need 1 Attorney III for developing regulations, advising on program operations, and representing the commissioner in enforcement of the Act.

NDOL will use its IT team for development of the registration system. As drafted, the registration requires several documents which NDOL will need to store. IT costs are estimated at \$442,672 for initial build and \$103,008 for annual maintenance costs.

Initial Costs include 1 full time Web Developer for 6 months, 30 days work from a NDOL Database Administrator, 1 full time Business Analyst for 6 months, 20 hours from an OCIO Senior Database and System Administrator, and costs for additional server and database storage.

Additionally, NDOL will use Nebraska Interactive to set up an online payment portal. This cost is free to the agency, but all online payments have a \$12.45 transaction fee. 20% of total transaction fees goes to the Nebraska Secretary of State. This would be approximately \$1,335 per year.
