This bill modifies provisions of the Adult Protective Services Central Registry and the Central Registry of Child Protection Cases. The bill requires that no person be entered on the registry without first being notified of the right to contest the determination. Certified mail notifications are already required to be issued. However, the bill would require that the notification be issued prior to officially being entered onto the registry, offering the accused an opportunity for appeal. Changes to the letter would be required but the fiscal impact of updates is nominal.

The bill increases the maximum fee to check the central registry from \$3 per request to \$5. The Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), who administers the registry, indicates that based on the annual number of background checks (146,000) the increased revenue would amount to \$292,000. Costs to update systems to accommodate the rate increase can be absorbed within current agency appropriations.
