Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

As amended, this bill creates the Community Health Worker Training Endorsement Act, changes provisions for pharmacists and pharmacies, changes requirements for licensed massage therapy establishments, permits use of fluroscopy by medical radiographers in collaboration with nurse practitioners, and provides for liens for professional services provided by physical therapists. Additionally the bill includes provisions that change the practice of pharmacy, eliminate liability for negligence of physician assistants, provides requirements for automated medication systems, and requires training on domestic abuse for mental health practitioners. These provisions have no fiscal impact.

Additionally the bill adopts both the Respiratory Care Interstate Compact (LB 735) and the Athletic Trainer Compact (LB 736) which each have a \$38,000 annual General Fund impact to the Department of Health and Human Services beginning in FY28.

The bill also adopts changes to the Child Care Licensing Act, proposed in LB 891, permitting prospective child care staff to begin working under supervision following a qualifying background check. This policy would necessitate additional DHHS staff (\$187,151 General Funds in FY27 and \$262,010 General Funds in FY28 and beyond) and licensing system fees (\$40,000 Cash Funds in FY27 only) to implement a two tier eligibility determination notification system.

The Nebraska State Patrol indicates minimal fiscal impact to the provisions of the bill.
