LEGISLATIVE BILL 196

Introduced by Storm, 23. Read first time January 14, 2025 Committee:

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; to amend section 60-6,356,
2	Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to authorize the operation of
3	all-terrain vehicles and utility-type vehicles between the hours of
4	sunset and sunrise if used for snow removal as prescribed; to
5	harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original section.
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6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 60-6,356, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,
 is amended to read:

60-6,356 (1) An all-terrain vehicle or a utility-type vehicle shall 3 not be operated on any controlled-access highway with more than two 4 marked traffic lanes. The crossing of any controlled-access highway with 5 more than two marked traffic lanes shall not be permitted except as 6 7 provided in subsections (9) and (10) of this section. Subsections (2), (3), and (5) through (8) of this section authorize and apply to operation 8 9 of an all-terrain vehicle or a utility-type vehicle only on a highway 10 other than a controlled-access highway with more than two marked traffic lanes. 11

(2) An all-terrain vehicle or a utility-type vehicle may be operated
in accordance with the operating requirements of subsection (3) of this
section:

15 (a) Outside the corporate limits of city, village, а or unincorporated village if incidental to the vehicle's 16 use for 17 agricultural purposes;

(b) Within the corporate limits of a city or village if authorized
by the city or village by ordinance adopted in accordance with this
section; or

(c) Within an unincorporated village if authorized by the county
board of the county in which the unincorporated village is located by
resolution in accordance with this section.

24 <u>(3)(a)</u> (3) An all-terrain vehicle or a utility-type vehicle may be 25 operated as authorized in subsection (2) of this section when such 26 operation occurs<u>:</u>

27 (i) Between only between the hours of sunrise and sunset; or -

(ii) Between the hours of sunset and sunrise for purposes of snow
 removal within the corporate limits of a city or village or within an
 unincorporated village.

31 (b) Any person operating an all-terrain vehicle or a utility-type

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1 vehicle as authorized in subsection (2) of this section shall:

2 (i) Have have a valid Class O operator's license or a farm permit as 3 provided in section 60-4,126;

4 (ii) Have , shall have liability insurance coverage for the all5 terrain vehicle or a utility-type vehicle while operating such the all6 terrain vehicle or a utility-type vehicle on a highway; , and

7 (iii) Not shall not operate the all-terrain or utility-type such
8 vehicle at a speed in excess of thirty miles per hour.

9 <u>(c)</u> The person operating <u>an</u> the all-terrain vehicle or a utility-10 type vehicle shall provide proof of such insurance coverage to any peace 11 officer requesting such proof within five days of such a request.

(d) When operating an all-terrain vehicle or a utility-type vehicle as authorized in subsection (2) of this section, the headlight and taillight of the vehicle shall be on and the vehicle shall be equipped with a bicycle safety flag which extends not less than five feet above ground attached to the rear of such vehicle. The bicycle safety flag shall be triangular in shape with an area of not less than thirty square inches and shall be day-glow in color.

(4) All-terrain vehicles and utility-type vehicles may be operated
without complying with subsection (3) of this section on highways in
parades which have been authorized by the State of Nebraska or any
department, board, commission, or political subdivision of the state.

(5) The crossing of a highway other than a controlled-access highway with more than two marked traffic lanes shall be permitted by an allterrain vehicle or a utility-type vehicle without complying with subsection (3) of this section only if:

(a) The crossing is made at an angle of approximately ninety degrees
to the direction of the highway and at a place where no obstruction
prevents a quick and safe crossing;

30 (b) The vehicle is brought to a complete stop before crossing the31 shoulder or roadway of the highway;

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(c) The operator yields the right-of-way to all oncoming traffic
 that constitutes an immediate potential hazard;

3 (d) In crossing a divided highway, the crossing is made only at an
4 intersection of such highway with another highway; and

5 (e) Both the headlight and taillight of the vehicle are on when the6 crossing is made.

7 (6) All-terrain vehicles and utility-type vehicles may be operated 8 outside the corporate limits of any municipality by electric utility 9 personnel within the course of their employment in accordance with the 10 operation requirements of subsection (3) of this section, except that the 11 operation of the vehicle pursuant to this subsection need not be limited 12 to the hours between sunrise and sunset.

(7) A city or village may adopt an ordinance authorizing the operation of all-terrain vehicles and utility-type vehicles within the corporate limits of the city or village if the operation is in accordance with subsection (3) of this section. The city or village may place other restrictions on the operation of all-terrain vehicles and utility-type vehicles within its corporate limits.

(8) A county board may adopt a resolution authorizing the operation 19 all-terrain vehicles and utility-type vehicles 20 of within any unincorporated village within the county if the operation is in 21 accordance with subsection (3) of this section. The county may place 22 other restrictions on the operation of all-terrain vehicles and utility-23 24 type vehicles within the unincorporated village.

(9) Except as provided in subsection (10) of this section, the crossing of a controlled-access highway with more than two marked traffic lanes shall be permitted by a utility-type vehicle if the operation is in accordance with the operation requirements of subsection (3) of this section and if the following requirements are met:

30 (a) The crossing is made at an intersection that:

31 (i) Is controlled by a traffic control signal; or

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(ii) For any intersection located outside the corporate limits of a
 city or village, is controlled by stop signs;

3 (b) The crossing at such intersection is made in compliance with the4 traffic control signal or stop signs; and

5 (c) The crossing at such intersection is specifically authorized as6 follows:

7 (i) If such intersection is located within the corporate limits of a8 city or village, by ordinance of such city or village;

9 (ii) If such intersection is located within an unincorporated 10 village, by resolution of the county board of the county in which such 11 unincorporated village is located; or

(iii) If such intersection is located outside the corporate limits of a city or village and outside any unincorporated village, by resolution of the county board of the county in which such intersection is located.

16 (10) When the use of the all-terrain vehicle or utility-type vehicle 17 is for an agricultural purpose, the crossing of a controlled-access 18 highway with more than two marked traffic lanes shall be permitted if 19 such vehicle is operated in accordance with subsection (3) of this 20 section.
