Committee:

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to amend section 79-760.01,
- 2 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to require the State Board of
- 3 Eduction to adopt academic content standards on human embryology
- 4 under the science education standards as prescribed; to repeal the
- 5 original section; and to declare an emergency.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- **Section 1.** Section 79-760.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,
- 2 is amended to read:
- 3 79-760.01 (1) The State Board of Education shall adopt measurable
- 4 academic content standards for at least the grade levels required for
- 5 statewide assessment pursuant to section 79-760.03. The standards shall
- 6 cover the subject areas of reading, writing, mathematics, science, and
- 7 social studies.
- 8 (2)(a) The board shall also adopt measurable academic content
- 9 standards for the following as part of the social studies standards:
- 10 (i) Financial literacy; and
- 11 (ii) Education on the Holocaust and other acts of genocide as
- 12 recognized by the Congress of the United States or the United Nations as
- 13 of January 1, 2022.
- 14 (b) On or before March 1, 2024, the board shall also adopt
- 15 measurable academic content standards for computer science and technology
- 16 education under the mathematics, science, or career and technical
- 17 education standards.
- 18 (c)(i) On or before March 1, 2026, the board shall adopt measurable
- 19 academic content standards for human embryology under the science
- 20 <u>education standards. Such standards shall be integrated into each</u>
- 21 school's curriculum no later than the start of the 2026-27 school year
- 22 and shall include:
- 23 (A) Instruction on human development that accurately portrays the
- 24 biological science of human embryology, including the Carnegie Stages of
- 25 Human Embryonic Development, in the curriculum of elementary, middle
- 26 school, and high school students; and
- 27 <u>(B) High-definition visual recordings which are of at least four-</u>
- 28 dimensional quality, commonly referred to as 4D. The visual recordings
- 29 <u>shall show the development of the brain, heart, sex organs, and other</u>
- 30 <u>vital organs throughout fetal development.</u>
- 31 (ii) A parent, guardian, or educational decisionmaker as defined in

- 1 <u>section 79-530 may opt such parent's, guardian's, or educational</u>
- 2 <u>decisionmaker's student out of the instruction provided pursuant to</u>
- 3 $\frac{\text{subdivision }(2)(c)(i) \text{ of this section.}}{}$
- 4 (3) Academic content standards adopted or recommended pursuant to
- 5 this section shall be sufficiently clear and measurable to be used for
- 6 testing student performance with respect to mastery of the content
- 7 described in the state standards.
- 8 (4) The State Board of Education shall develop a plan to review and
- 9 update standards for each subject area every seven years. The state board
- 10 plan shall include a review of commonly accepted standards adopted by
- 11 school districts.
- 12 Sec. 2. Original section 79-760.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 13 Nebraska, is repealed.
- 14 Sec. 3. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 15 passed and approved according to law.
