## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 217**

Introduced by Fredrickson, 20. Read first time January 14, 2025 Committee:

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to child welfare; to amend section 71-1904,
2	Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 71-1924, Revised
3	Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2024; to require suicide awareness
4	and prevention training for employees of child-placing agencies and
5	child welfare workers; to provide an operative date; and to repeal
6	the original sections.

7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1	Section 1. For purposes of providing training for individuals
2	involved in the child welfare system, the Department of Health and Human
3	Services shall develop a baseline of curriculum and training materials
4	related to suicide awareness and prevention in consultation with
5	statewide and national organizations and professionals with expertise in
6	behavioral and mental health and suicide prevention, including, but not
7	limited to, the Nebraska State Suicide Prevention Coalition and the
8	<u>Behavioral Health Education Center of Nebraska. All such suicide</u>
9	awareness and prevention training shall incorporate evidence-based
10	practices and may include, but not be limited to, (1) identification of
11	early warning signs and symptoms of behavioral and mental health issues
12	for youth in the child welfare system and (2) appropriate and effective
13	responses for behavioral and mental health issues and trauma-informed
14	<u>care.</u>
15	Sec. 2. All staff involved in the child welfare system of the
16	Department of Health and Human Services that provide direct services to

17 children or families or interact directly with children or families, and any other appropriate personnel as determined by the Division of Children 18 19 and Family Services of the Department of Health and Human Services, shall 20 have training in suicide awareness and prevention. Such training shall include at least ninety minutes of behavioral and mental health training 21 22 with a focus on suicide awareness and prevention prior to any independent 23 contact with youth and families and annually thereafter. Such training 24 shall be provided within the framework of existing training programs 25 offered by the department.

26 Sec. 3. Section 71-1904, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is 27 amended to read:

71-1904 (1) The department shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations pursuant to sections 71-1901 to 71-1906.01 for (a) the proper care and protection of children by licensees under such sections, (b) the issuance, suspension, and revocation of licenses to provide foster care,

1 (c) the issuance, suspension, and revocation of probationary licenses to 2 provide foster care, (d) the issuance, suspension, and revocation of provisional licenses to provide foster care, (e) the provision of 3 4 training in foster care, which training shall be directly related to the skills necessary to care for children in need of out-of-home care, 5 neglected, dependent, and but not limited to, abused, 6 including, delinquent children, and (f) the proper administration of sections 7 8 71-1901 to 71-1906.01.

9 (2) The department may issue a waiver for any licensing standard not related to children's safety for a relative home that is pursuing 10 licensure. Such waivers shall be granted on a case-by-case basis upon 11 assessment by the department based upon the best interests of the child. 12 A relative home that receives a waiver pursuant to this subsection shall 13 be considered fully licensed for purposes of federal reimbursement under 14 the federal Fostering Connections to Success and Increasing Adoptions Act 15 of 2008, Public Law 110-351. 16

(3) The department shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations 17 new foster licensing requirements that 18 establishing home ensure children's safety, health, and well-being but minimize the use of 19 licensing mandates for nonsafety issues. Such rules and regulations shall 20 provide alternatives to address nonsafety issues regarding housing and 21 22 provide assistance to families in overcoming licensing barriers, especially in child-specific relative and kinship placements, to maximize 23 24 appropriate reimbursement under Title IV-E of the federal Social Security 25 Act, as amended, including expanding the use of kinship guardianship assistance payments under 42 U.S.C. 673(d), as such act and section 26 existed on January 1, 2013. 27

(4) The department shall include suicide awareness and prevention
training meeting the requirements of section 1 of this act for initial
licensure and renewal of licensure pursuant to sections 71-1901 to
71-1906.01.

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2 71-1924 Sections 71-1924 to 71-1951 and section 5 of this act shall 3 4 be known and may be cited as the Children's Residential Facilities and 5 Placing Licensure Act.

The department shall establish standardized suicide 6 Sec. 5. 7 awareness and prevention training requirements for all employees of a child-placing agency prior to any independent contact with youth and 8 9 families. Such training shall incorporate a baseline of curriculum 10 materials described in section 1 of this act while also allowing a child-11 placing agency to incorporate training elements that meet the specific needs of the individual agency. The department may approve the existing 12 curriculum of a child-placing agency if such curriculum meets the 13 14 baseline of curriculum pursuant to section 1 of this act.

Sec. 6. This act becomes operative on October 1, 2025. 15
