# **LEGISLATIVE BILL 222**

Introduced by McKinney, 11.

Read first time January 14, 2025

### Committee:

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to law enforcement; to amend sections 60-683 2 and 81-2005, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 3 60-601, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2024; to change 4 provisions relating to stopping or detaining the operator of a 5 vehicle under the Nebraska Rules of the Road; to change duties of 6 peace officers, the Superintendent of Law Enforcement and Public 7 Safety, and certain officers of the Nebraska State Patrol; to 8 harmonize provisions; to repeal the original sections; and to 9 declare an emergency.
- 10 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- **Section 1.** Section 60-601, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 2 2024, is amended to read:
- 3 60-601 Sections 60-601 to 60-6,383 <u>and sections 3 and 4 of this act</u>
- 4 shall be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Rules of the Road.
- 5 Sec. 2. Section 60-683, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 6 amended to read:
- 7 60-683 (1) All peace officers are hereby specifically directed and
- 8 authorized and it shall be deemed and considered a part of the official
- 9 duties of each of such officers to enforce the provisions of the Nebraska
- 10 Rules of the Road, including the specific enforcement of maximum speed
- 11 limits, and any other law regulating the operation of vehicles or the use
- 12 of the highways.
- 13 (2) To perform the official duties imposed by this section, the
- 14 Superintendent of Law Enforcement and Public Safety and all officers of
- 15 the Nebraska State Patrol shall have the powers stated in section
- 16 81-2005.
- 17 (3) Except as provided in sections 3 and 4 of this act, all All
- 18 other peace officers shall have the power:
- 19 (a)  $\frac{1}{1}$  To make arrests upon view and without warrant for any
- 20 violation committed in their presence of any of the provisions of the
- 21 Motor Vehicle Operator's License Act or of any other law regulating the
- 22 operation of vehicles or the use of the highways, if and when designated
- 23 or called upon to do so as provided by law;
- 24 (b) (2) To make arrests upon view and without warrant for any
- 25 violation committed in their presence of any provision of the laws of
- 26 this state relating to misdemeanors or felonies, if and when designated
- 27 or called upon to do so as provided by law;
- 28 (c) (3) At all times to direct all traffic in conformity with law
- 29 or, in the event of a fire or other emergency or in order to expedite
- 30 traffic or insure safety, to direct traffic as conditions may require;
- 31 (d) (4) When in uniform, to require the driver of a vehicle to stop

- 1 and exhibit his or her operator's license and registration certificate
- 2 issued for the vehicle and submit to an inspection of such vehicle and
- 3 the license plates and registration certificate for the vehicle and to
- 4 require the driver of a motor vehicle to present the vehicle within five
- 5 days for correction of any defects revealed by such motor vehicle
- 6 inspection as may lead the inspecting officer to reasonably believe that
- 7 such motor vehicle is being operated in violation of the statutes of
- 8 Nebraska or the rules and regulations of the Director of Motor Vehicles;
- 9 (e) (5) To inspect any vehicle of a type required to be registered
- 10 according to law in any public garage or repair shop or in any place
- 11 where such a vehicle is held for sale or wrecking;
- 12  $\underline{\text{(f)}}$  To serve warrants relating to the enforcement of the laws
- 13 regulating the operation of vehicles or the use of the highways; and
- 14 (g) (7) To investigate traffic accidents for the purpose of carrying
- on a study of traffic accidents and enforcing motor vehicle and highway
- 16 safety laws.
- 17 Sec. 3. (1) For purposes of this section, immediate, serious threat
- 18 to the safety of the operator or any other person means that, based on
- 19 the totality of the circumstances, it is reasonable for an objective
- 20 observer to believe that an equipment failure on the vehicle could cause
- 21 immediate, serious injury to the operator or any other person in the
- 22 vicinity of the vehicle.
- 23 <u>(2) A peace officer shall not stop or detain an operator of a</u>
- 24 <u>vehicle to enforce any of the following violations:</u>
- 25 (a) Any nonmoving traffic violation;
- 26 (b) Driving while such operator's license is suspended or revoked
- 27 <u>under section 60-4,100 or 60-4,108; or</u>
- 28 <u>(c) Any warrant for a misdemeanor, other than a warrant for a </u>
- 29 <u>misdemeanor:</u>
- 30 (i) Under section 28-306, 60-498.01, 60-698, 60-6,196, 60-6,197, or
- 31 60-6, 198;

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1 (ii) Under subdivision (4), (5), (6), (7), (8), (9), or (10) of

- 2 section 60-6,197.03;
- 3 (iii) For a violation of a protection order; or
- 4 (iv) For violation of a civil court order.
- 5 (3)(a) A peace officer shall not stop or detain an operator of a
- 6 <u>vehicle if the primary reason for such stop or detention is an equipment</u>
- 7 failure violation unless such violation:
- 8 (i) Relates to the vehicle operated by the operator; and
- 9 (ii) Poses an immediate, serious threat to the safety of the
- 10 operator or any other person.
- 11 (b) Prior to stopping or detaining the operator of the vehicle under
- 12 <u>this subsection, the peace officer shall log digitally or notify dispatch</u>
- 13 of the primary reason for the stop before initiating the stop or
- 14 <u>detainment</u>, including a detailed description of the immediate, serious
- 15 threat to the safety of the operator or any other person.
- 16 <u>(c) Upon first contact with the operator of the vehicle during a</u>
- 17 stop or detainment under this subsection, the peace officer shall inform
- 18 the operator of the reason for the stop or detainment, and shall not
- 19 request a consent search under section 4 of this act of the operator, any
- 20 <u>passenger</u>, or the vehicle.
- 21 (d) The peace officer shall not question the operator or any
- 22 passenger of the vehicle on a subject other than the equipment failure
- 23 violation that initiated the stop, unless the peace officer observes
- 24 evidence in plain view that establishes reasonable suspicion sufficient
- 25 to question the operator or any passenger about an independent criminal
- 26 offense.
- 27 **Sec. 4.** (1) For purposes of this section, authorized person means
- 28 the operator of the vehicle.
- 29 (2) Prior to searching any vehicle, a peace officer shall obtain a
- 30 warrant or written consent to search such vehicle from an authorized
- 31 person.

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1 (3) To obtain such written consent, the peace officer shall provide

- 2 <u>the authorized person:</u>
- 3 (a) An oral explanation of the reason for and effects of providing
- 4 written consent; and
- 5 (b) A written consent form that explains the purpose of the search,
- 6 that the search is voluntary, that such authorized person may ask to
- 7 speak with an attorney prior to consenting to such search, and that such
- 8 <u>authorized person may choose not to consent to the search or may revoke</u>
- 9 consent to the search at any point.
- 10 (4) The written form provided under this section shall state plainly
- 11 <u>and explicitly that such authorized person shall not be punished or</u>
- 12 <u>suffer retaliation for not consenting to be searched or revoking such</u>
- 13 consent.
- 14 <u>(5) Such written form shall be:</u>
- 15 (a) Available in the English and Spanish languages; and
- (b) Explained orally to any authorized person who is unable to read
- 17 the form. An interpreter service shall be used when necessary.
- 18 <u>(6) Any evidence observed or seized during a stop, detention, or</u>
- 19 search made in violation of this section is inadmissible in any criminal
- 20 proceeding.
- 21 Sec. 5. Section 81-2005, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 22 amended to read:
- 23 81-2005 On and after July 20, 2002, the Superintendent of Law
- 24 Enforcement and Public Safety and all officers of the Nebraska State
- 25 Patrol, except all carrier enforcement officers assigned to the carrier
- 26 enforcement division, and except as provided in sections 3 and 4 of this
- 27 <u>act, shall have the power:</u>
- 28 (1) Of peace officers for the purpose of enforcing the Motor Vehicle
- 29 Operator's License Act, the Motor Vehicle Registration Act, the Nebraska
- 30 Rules of the Road, and any other law regulating the registration or
- 31 operation of vehicles or the use of the highways;

- 1 (2) To make arrests upon view and without warrant for any violation
- 2 committed in their presence of any of the provisions of the Motor Vehicle
- 3 Operator's License Act, the Motor Vehicle Registration Act, the Nebraska
- 4 Rules of the Road, or any other law regulating the operation of vehicles
- 5 or the use of the highways, if and when designated or called upon to do
- 6 so as provided by law;
- 7 (3) To make arrests upon view and without warrant for any violation
- 8 committed in their presence of any provision of the laws of the state
- 9 relating to misdemeanors or felonies, if and when designated or called
- 10 upon to do so as provided by law;
- 11 (4) At all times to direct all traffic in conformity with law or, in
- 12 the event of a fire or other emergency or in order to expedite traffic or
- 13 insure safety, to direct traffic as conditions may require
- 14 notwithstanding the provisions of law;
- 15 (5) When in uniform, to require the driver of a vehicle to stop and
- 16 exhibit his or her operator's license and registration card issued for
- 17 the vehicle and submit to an inspection of such vehicle and the license
- 18 plates and registration card thereon and to require the drivers of motor
- 19 vehicles to present such vehicles within five days for correction of any
- 20 defects revealed by such motor vehicle inspection as may lead the
- 21 inspecting officer to reasonably believe that such motor vehicle is being
- 22 operated in violation of the statutes of Nebraska or the rules and
- 23 regulations of the Director of Motor Vehicles;
- 24 (6) To inspect any vehicle of a type required to be registered under
- 25 the Motor Vehicle Registration Act in any public garage or repair shop or
- in any place where such vehicles are held for sale or wrecking;
- 27 (7) To serve warrants relating to the enforcement of the laws
- 28 regulating the operation of vehicles or the use of the highways;
- 29 (8) To investigate traffic accidents for the purpose of carrying on
- 30 a study of traffic accidents and enforcing motor vehicle and highway
- 31 safety laws; and

- 1 (9) To operate weighing stations and portable scales and to perform
- 2 carrier enforcement powers and duties prescribed in sections 60-1301 to
- 3 60-1309.
- 4 Carrier enforcement officers appointed to the carrier enforcement
- 5 division before July 20, 2002, shall have the powers and duties
- 6 prescribed in sections 60-1301 to 60-1309.
- 7 Sec. 6. Original sections 60-683 and 81-2005, Reissue Revised
- 8 Statutes of Nebraska, and section 60-601, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 9 Supplement, 2024, are repealed.
- 10 Sec. 7. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 11 passed and approved according to law.
