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Section 1. Section 81-3501, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:

9 (2) The membership of the board shall include one education member 10 who is licensed in geology and who is a member of the professional 11 faculty of a geology or related geosciences department of a college or 12 university located in Nebraska, recommended by the president of the 13 respective college or university, and appointed by the Governor.

14 (3) The membership of the board shall include one public member
 15 appointed by the Governor. The appointment is for five years.

16 <u>(4)(a)</u> (4) The board may designate <u>any number of a former members</u> 17 member of the board as an emeritus <u>members</u> member. Emeritus member 18 status, when conferred, <u>is valid for one year from the date of conferment</u> 19 <u>and may be renewed by the board any number of times.</u> must be renewed 20 <u>annually. 3 established by the board and shall accompany the application. The fee
4 shall not exceed three hundred dollars per year.

5 (4) The fee for emeritus status shall be established by the board 6 and shall accompany the application. The fee shall not exceed one hundred 7 dollars per year.

8 (5) If the board denies the issuance of a certificate to any 9 applicant, including the application of an organization for a certificate 10 of authorization, the board shall retain the fee.

81-3528 (1) The practice or offer to practice for others of geology 13 by individuals licensed under the Geologists Regulation Act through an 14 organization is permitted if the criteria for organizational practice 15 16 established by the board are met and the organization has been issued a certificate of authorization by the board. All technical submissions by 17 an organization involving the practice of geology when issued or filed 18 for public record shall be dated and bear the seal of the professional 19 licensed geologist who prepared the submission or under whose immediate 20 direction it was prepared. 21

(2) An organization desiring a certificate of authorization shall 22 file with the board an application, using the form provided by the board, 23 24 which also contains a list of the names and addresses of all officers of the organization, duly licensed to practice geology in the state through 25 the organization.  from performing professional services for itself.

3 (4) An organization is not relieved of its responsibility for the 4 conduct or acts of its agents, employees, officers, or partners by reason 5 of its compliance with this section. An individual practicing geology is 6 not relieved of his or her responsibility for services performed by 7 reason of employment or any other relationship with an organization 8 holding a certificate of authorization.

(5) The Commencing one year after January 1, 1999, the Secretary of 9 10 State shall not issue a certificate of authority to do business in this state or accept an applicant or a registration of name from to a foreign 11 firm to an organization that intends to practice geology, which includes 12 13 among the objectives for which it is established geology or any 14 modification or derivation of geology, unless the board has issued such 15 organization the applicant a certificate of authorization or a letter 16 indicating the eligibility of such organization the applicant to receive 17 a certificate of authorization from the board or to register such name. The organization shall supply the certificate or letter with its 18 19 application for incorporation or licensure.

(6) The Commencing one year after January 1, 1999, the Secretary of 20 State shall not register any trade name or service mark that which 21 22 includes the word geology, words professional geologist, or any modification or derivative of such word, in the trade name or service 23 24 mark of an organization unless the board has issued such organization a certificate of authorization or a letter indicating the eligibility of 25 such organization to receive a certificate of authorization or to 26 register such trade name or service mark. its firm name or logotype 27 28 except to those organizations holding a certificate of authorization issued by the board. 29

30 (7) The certificate of authorization shall be renewed periodically31 as required by the board.

(8) A geologist who renders occasional, part-time, or consulting
 services to or for an organization may not for purposes of this section
 be designated as being responsible for the professional activities of the
 organization.

7 81-3529 (1) The board shall issue to any applicant, who τ on the basis of education, experience, and examination $\frac{1}{1000}$ if required pursuant to 8 9 section 81-3539, has met the requirements of the Geologists Regulation Act, a certificate of licensure as a professional geologist that 10 authorizes such person giving the licensed geologist proper authority to 11 carry out the prerogatives of the act. The certificate of licensure shall 12 13 carry the designation Licensed Professional Geologist. (3)(a) Each <u>professional geologist</u> licensee authorized to practice geology <u>shall must</u> obtain a seal. The design of the seal shall be determined by the board. The following information shall be on the seal: State of Nebraska; <u>the professional geologist's</u> licensee's name; <u>the</u> <u>professional geologist's</u> licensee's license number; and the words Licensed Professional Geologist.

(b) Whenever the seal is applied, the professional geologist's
 licensee's signature shall be across the seal. The board may adopt and
 promulgate rules and regulations for application of the seal.

30 (c) The seal and the date of its placement shall be on all technical31 submissions and calculations whenever presented to a client or any public

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or governmental agency. It shall be unlawful for <u>any person</u> a licensee to affix <u>such person's his or her</u> seal or to permit <u>such his or her</u> seal to be affixed to any document after the expiration of the certificate or for the purpose of aiding or abetting any other person to evade or attempt to evade the act.

(d) The seal and date shall be placed on all originals, copies, 6 7 tracings, or other reproducible documents in such a manner that the seal, signature, and date will be reproduced. The application of a professional 8 9 geologist's the licensee's seal shall constitute certification that the work was done by such professional geologist or under the responsible 10 charge of such professional geologist. the licensee or under the 11 licensee's control. In the case of multiple sealings, the first or title 12 page shall be sealed and dated by all involved. In addition, each sheet 13 shall be sealed and dated by the professional geologist licensee 14 responsible for each sheet. In the case of an organization, each sheet 15 shall be sealed and dated by the professional geologist licensee 16 17 involved. The professional geologist in responsible charge shall seal and date the title or first sheet. 18

(e) In the case of a temporary permit issued to <u>an individual from a</u>
licensee of another state, the licensee shall use his or her state of
licensure seal and shall affix his or her signature and temporary permit
to all <u>of</u> his or her work.

(4) The board shall issue to any applicant who, in the opinion of
the board, has met the requirements of the act, an enrollment <u>certificate</u>
card as geologist-intern <u>that</u> which indicates that <u>such geologist-</u>
<u>intern's</u> his or her name has been recorded as such in the board office.
The geologist-intern enrollment <u>certificate</u> card does not authorize the
<u>such geologist-intern</u> holder to practice as a professional geologist.

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professional license in any other jurisdiction. The board shall review the application for renewal. If the board takes no action, the license shall be renewed. The board may deny renewal if it determines the applicant does not meet the requirements for licensure or renewal.
