## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 523**

Introduced by Juarez, 5.

Read first time January 21, 2025

Committee: Education

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to education; to adopt the Student Teacher
- 2 Compensation Act; to state intent relating to funding; to provide an
- 3 operative date; and to declare an emergency.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 7 of this act shall be known and may be

- 2 <u>cited as the Student Teacher Compensation Act.</u>
- 3 **Sec. 2.** The Legislature finds and declares:
- 4 (1) Student teaching is a critical component of teacher preparation
- 5 and requires significant time and effort;
- 6 (2) Many student teachers face financial hardships due to the unpaid
- 7 nature of the teaching practicum, which limits the ability for student
- 8 teachers to work additional jobs;
- 9 (3) Nebraska faces a teacher shortage, particularly in high-need
- 10 <u>subject areas and rural parts of the state; and</u>
- 11 (4) Providing financial compensation to student teachers will
- 12 <u>support the academic and professional success of such students while</u>
- 13 encouraging more individuals to enter and complete a teacher education
- 14 program.
- 15 **Sec. 3.** For purposes of the Student Teacher Compensation Act:
- 16 (1) Accredited teacher education program means a program at a
- 17 college or university accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by
- 18 the United States Department of Education and determined to be acceptable
- 19 by the State Board of Education that prepares individuals for teacher
- 20 certification;
- 21 (2) Participating school means any public, private, denominational,
- 22 or parochial school in Nebraska hosting a student teacher; and
- 23 (3) Student teacher means an individual enrolled in an accredited
- 24 teacher education program who is completing a supervised teaching
- 25 practicum in a participating school as part of the requirements for
- 26 teacher certification.
- 27 Sec. 4. (1) The State Department of Education shall develop a
- 28 stipend program to provide financial compensation to student teachers as
- 29 provided in this section. The department shall provide a stipend of four
- 30 thousand dollars per student-teaching semester to any student teacher
- 31 that applies for such stipend and is eligible pursuant to subsection (3)

- 1 of this section.
- 2 <u>(2) A student teacher may apply to the department in a manner</u>
- 3 prescribed by the Commissioner of Education for a stipend under the
- 4 Student Teacher Compensation Act. Such application shall include:
- 5 (a) The name of the student-teacher;
- 6 (b) The name of the accredited teacher education program in which
- 7 the student teacher is enrolled;
- 8 (c) The participating school in which the student teacher is
- 9 <u>completing a supervised teaching practicum;</u>
- 10 (d) A demonstration of financial hardship in a manner determined by
- 11 <u>the department; and</u>
- 12 (e) Any other information the department may require.
- 13 (3) A student teacher shall be eligible for a stipend if the student
- 14 <u>teacher:</u>
- 15 (a) Is enrolled in an accredited teacher education program in
- 16 Nebraska;
- 17 (b) Is in the process of completing or signed a contract to complete
- 18 a supervised teaching practicum at a participating school; and
- 19 (c) Demonstrates a financial need in a manner determined by the
- 20 department.
- 21 Sec. 5. (1) The State Department of Education shall electronically
- 22 submit an annual report to the Clerk of the Legislature and the Governor
- 23 detailing the implementation of the Student Teacher Compensation Act. The
- 24 report shall be available to the public and posted on the department's
- 25 website.
- 26 (2)(a) The report shall include:
- 27 (i) The number of student teachers receiving a stipend;
- 28 <u>(ii) The distribution by geographic area and subject matter area of</u>
- 29 <u>student teachers receiving a stipend; and</u>
- 30 (iii) Feedback from participants and schools regarding the
- 31 effectiveness of the Student Teacher Compensation Act.

1 (b) The report shall not identify any individual person or school

- 2 providing feedback.
- 3 **Sec. 6.** It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate funds
- 4 annually to the State Department of Education to provide stipends to
- 5 <u>student teachers pursuant to the Student Teacher Compensation Act. The</u>
- 6 <u>department may also seek additional funding through grants, private</u>
- 7 donations, or federal programs.
- 8 Sec. 7. The State Board of Education may adopt and promulgate rules
- 9 and regulations to carry out the Student Teacher Compensation Act.
- 10 Sec. 8. This act becomes operative on July 1, 2025.
- 11 Sec. 9. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 12 passed and approved according to law.
