LEGISLATIVE BILL 528

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to learning platforms; to amend section
2	79-1054, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to define terms; to
3	change provisions relating to grants funded from the State
4	Department of Education Improvement Grant Fund; to provide powers
5	and duties to the Department of Economic Development relating to
6	grants for learning platforms; to eliminate obsolete provisions; and
7	to repeal the original section.

8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 79-1054, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
 amended to read:

3 79-1054 (1)(a) This subsection applies until July 1, 2024.

4 (b) The State Board of Education shall establish a competitive 5 innovation grant program with funding from the Nebraska Education 6 Improvement Fund pursuant to section 79-3501. Grantees shall be a school 7 district, an educational service unit, or a combination of entities that includes at least one school district or educational service unit. For 8 9 grantees that consist of a combination of entities, a participating 10 school district or educational service unit shall be designated to act as the fiscal agent and administer the program funded by the grant. The 11 state board shall only award grants pursuant to applications that the 12 13 state board deems to be sufficiently innovative and to have a high chance of success. 14

15 (c) An application for a grant pursuant to this subsection shall
16 describe:

17 (i) Specific measurable objectives for improving education outcomes 18 for early childhood students, elementary students, middle school 19 students, or high school students or for improving the transitions 20 between any successive stages of education or between education and the 21 workforce;

(ii) The method for annually evaluating progress toward a measurable
 objective, with a summative evaluation of progress submitted to the state
 board and electronically to the Education Committee of the Legislature on
 or before July 1, 2019;

26 (iii) The potential for the project to be both scalable and 27 replicable; and

(iv) Any cost savings that could be achieved by reductions in other
 programs if the funded program is successful.

30 (d) Based on evaluations received on or before July 1, 2019, for
 31 each grant, the State Board of Education shall recommend the grant

2 (i) Representing a best practice;

3 (ii) A model for a state-supported program; or

4 (iii) A local issue for further study.

5 (e) On or before December 1, 2017, and on or before December 1 of 6 each year thereafter, the state board shall electronically submit a 7 report to the Clerk of the Legislature on all such grants, including, but 8 not limited to, the results of the evaluations for each grant. The state 9 board may adopt and promulgate rules and regulations to carry out this 10 subsection, including, but not limited to, application procedures, 11 selection procedures, and annual evaluation reporting procedures.

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<u>(1)(a)</u> (2)(a) This subsection applies beginning July 1, 2024.

(b) The State Board of Education shall establish an improvement grant program in areas including, but not limited to, (i) teacher recruitment and retention, (ii) improvement for schools and school districts, (iii) improvement in student performance in the subject areas of reading and mathematics, and (iv) other improvement areas identified by the state board. Such grants shall be funded using lottery funds under section 79-3501.

(c) On or before December 1 of each calendar year, the state board shall electronically submit a report to the Clerk of the Legislature on all such grant programs, including, but not limited to, the recipients of the programs and evaluations of the effectiveness of each grant program. The state board may adopt and promulgate rules and regulations to carry out this subsection.

26 (2)(a) (3)(a) This subsection applies beginning January 1, 2024.

27 (b) For purposes of this subsection: τ

28 (i) Department means the Department of Economic Development; and

<u>(ii) Learning</u> learning platform means a three-dimensional, game based learning platform for use by middle school and high school
 students.

1 (c)(i) The <u>department</u> State Board of Education shall establish a 2 grant program to procure or purchase an annual license for a preexisting learning platform platforms for use in schools to engage students in 3 coursework and careers in science, technology, and engineering , and 4 mathematics. Such grants shall be funded using lottery funds pursuant to 5 section 79-3501. Grant funds shall only be used to procure or purchase an 6 annual license and shall not be awarded for the purpose of research and 7 development of a learning platform. 8

9 (ii) The State Board of Education shall establish standards that a 10 learning platform shall meet in the subject areas of chemistry, physical 11 science, and mathematics. The <u>department</u> state board shall develop the 12 criteria to prioritize the grant applications.

(iii)(A) (iii) A developer may apply to the <u>department</u> Commissioner
 of Education in a manner prescribed by the <u>department</u> state board for a
 grant under this subsection for a learning platform that:

16 <u>(I)</u> (A) Is designed to teach information related to chemistry, 17 physical science, or mathematics;

18 (II) (B) Aligns with the <u>academic content</u> standards established by 19 the <u>State Board of Education</u> state board relating to <u>high school</u> 20 chemistry<u>or</u> τ physical science <u>and the equivalent of such standards used</u> 21 <u>for middle school education</u> τ or mathematics;

<u>(III)</u> (C) Connects such standards with real-world technologies and
 applications;

<u>(IV)</u> (D) Highlights science, technology, <u>and</u> engineering , <u>and</u>
 mathematics career pathways in Nebraska; and

26 (V) Complies with the ISO 27001 data security standards; and (E)
 27 Meets any additional requirements set out by the State Board of
 28 Education.

29 <u>(VI) Demonstrates experience with statewide implementation of a</u>
 30 <u>learning platform.</u>

31 (B) A grant application approved by the Department of Economic

Development shall be awarded from the State Department of Education
 Improvement Grant Fund administered by the State Department of Education.
 (iv) Any developer that receives a grant under this subsection shall
 provide access to and use of its learning platform to all Nebraska school
 districts.

6 (v) Any grant awarded pursuant to this subsection shall be awarded7 by July 1 of each year.

8 (d) On or before December 1 of each calendar year, the <u>Department of</u> 9 <u>Economic Development</u> state board shall electronically submit a report to 10 the Clerk of the Legislature on the grant program, including, but not 11 limited to, the recipients of the program and evaluations of the 12 effectiveness of the grant program. The <u>department</u> State Board of 13 <u>Education</u> may adopt and promulgate rules and regulations to carry out 14 this subsection.

(3)(a) (4)(a) The State Department of Education Improvement Grant 15 Fund is created. The fund shall be administered by the State Department 16 17 of Education and shall consist of transfers pursuant to section 79-3501, repayments of grant funds, and interest payments received in the course 18 19 of administering this section. The fund shall be used to carry out this section. Transfers may be made from the fund to the Education Future Fund 20 at the direction of the Legislature. Any money in the State Department of 21 22 Education Improvement Grant Fund available for investment shall be invested by the state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital 23 24 Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.

(b) Of the ten percent of funds transferred to the fund pursuant to section 79-3501, eight and three-fourths percent shall be used for improvement grants pursuant to subsection (2) (3) of this section and the remaining one and one-fourth percent shall be used for grants pursuant to subsection (1) (2) of this section.
