1	A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Department of Health and Human
2	Services; to amend section 71-436.02, Reissue Revised Statutes of
3	Nebraska, and section 38-2847, Revised Statutes Cumulative
4	Supplement, 2024; to change licensure requirements for remote
5	dispensing pharmacies; to change verification requirements for
6	pharmacists as prescribed; and to repeal the original sections.
7	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 38-2847, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
 2024, is amended to read:

3 38-2847 (1) Verification means the confirmation by a supervising 4 pharmacist of the accuracy and completeness of the acts, tasks, or 5 functions undertaken by a pharmacy technician to assist the pharmacist in 6 the practice of pharmacy.

7 (2) Verification shall occur by a pharmacist on duty in the facility, except that verification may occur (a) by means of a real-time 8 9 audiovisual communication system if (\underline{i}) (a) a pharmacy technician performs authorized activities or functions to assist a pharmacist and 10 the prescribed drugs or devices will be administered to persons who are 11 patients or residents of a facility by a credentialed individual 12 authorized to administer medications, <u>or (ii)</u> (b) a pharmacy technician 13 is engaged in remote dispensing in compliance with section 71-436.02, or 14 (b) when (c) all of the following conditions are met: (i) The pharmacist 15 performing the verification of pharmacy technician data entry is located 16 in <u>a licensed pharmacy in Nebraska</u>, (ii) the physical product 17 verification occurs in person at the location where the prescription is 18 19 prepared, and (iii) the pharmacy maintains manual or electronic records that identify, individually for each order processed, the name, initials, 20 or identification code of each pharmacist, pharmacist intern, or pharmacy 21 technician who took part in all acts, tasks, or functions undertaken to 22 fulfill a prescription. 23

Sec. 2. Section 71-436.02, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:

71-436.02 (1) A pharmacy shall obtain a remote dispensing pharmacy license under the Health Care Facility Licensure Act prior to engaging in remote dispensing. A pharmacy shall not be licensed as both a remote dispensing pharmacy and a pharmacy. At the time of initial licensure as a remote dispensing pharmacy, the remote dispensing pharmacy must be located ten driving miles or more from the nearest pharmacy. The remote

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1 dispensing pharmacy shall operate in accordance with this section.

2 (2) If the remote dispensing pharmacy employs a certified pharmacy technician to dispense prescription drugs, remote dispensing shall occur 3 4 under remote supervision via a real-time audiovisual communication system 5 by a licensed pharmacist employed by a supervising pharmacy. The licensed pharmacist must be licensed and located in Nebraska. If the real-time 6 7 audiovisual communication system between the remote dispensing pharmacy and supervising pharmacy is not working, no remote dispensing can be 8 completed at the remote dispensing pharmacy until the real-time 9 10 audiovisual communication system is restored and working properly.

(3) The remote dispensing pharmacy must have the same pharmacist in 11 charge as the supervising pharmacy. The pharmacist in charge must ensure 12 13 that a pharmacist is onsite at the remote dispensing pharmacy at a 14 minimum of once each calendar month. The pharmacist in charge in the supervising pharmacy may delegate tasks to another pharmacist who is 15 16 employed by the supervising pharmacy, such as supervision of the certified pharmacy technician working remotely in the remote dispensing 17 pharmacy, oversight of inventory, patient counseling, and other duties as 18 assigned. The pharmacist supervising the certified pharmacy technician 19 remotely is responsible for the drug utilization review, the final 20 verification, and the supervision of the remote dispensing at the remote 21 22 dispensing pharmacy.

(4) In order for remote dispensing to occur in a remote dispensingpharmacy:

(a) When a prescription is being dispensed to a patient or
caregiver, the supervising pharmacist must attempt to counsel on all new
prescriptions dispensed from the remote dispensing pharmacy; and

(b) The real-time audiovisual communication system must be workingproperly.
