- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Animal Health and Disease Control Act;
- 2 to amend sections 54-2901, 54-2902, 54-2939, and 54-2948, Reissue
- 3 Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to define a term; to restate
- 4 legislative findings and declarations; to prohibit electronic
- 5 identification devices relating to foreign adversaries as
- 6 prescribed; to prohibit certain actions by the Department of
- 7 Agriculture; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original
- 8 sections.
- 9 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 54-2901, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 54-2901 Sections 54-2901 to 54-2957 <u>and section 3 of this act</u>shall
- 4 be known and may be cited as the Animal Health and Disease Control Act.
- 5 Sec. 2. Section 54-2902, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 6 amended to read:
- 7 54-2902 For purposes of sections 54-753.05 and 54-797 to 54-7,103
- 8 and the Animal Health and Disease Control Act, unless the context
- 9 otherwise requires, the definitions found in sections 54-2903 to 54-2938
- 10 and section 3 of this act shall be used.
- Sec. 3. Foreign adversary means any foreign government or foreign
- 12 <u>nongovernment person determined to be a foreign adversary pursuant to 15</u>
- 13 C.F.R. 791.4, as such regulation existed on January 1, 2025.
- 14 Sec. 4. Section 54-2939, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 15 amended to read:
- 16 54-2939 (1) The Legislature finds and declares it is the policy of
- 17 this state that:
- 18 (a) Animal animal health and disease control are essential to the
- 19 livestock industry and the health of the economy of Nebraska; -
- 20 <u>(b) It is in the economic and cultural interest of Nebraska to</u>
- 21 protect and conserve livestock resources;
- 22 <u>(c) Protection of private property rights, as they pertain to</u>
- 23 <u>livestock husbandry and management, supersede the interests of government</u>
- 24 <u>bureaucracy; and</u>
- 25 (d) Foreign adversaries who can leverage surveillance technology to
- 26 <u>disrupt the integrity of domestic livestock production present a threat</u>
- 27 <u>to the security and sovereignty of Nebraska and the United States of</u>
- 28 America.
- 29 (2) The purpose of the Animal Health and Disease Control Act is to
- 30 further the best interests of Nebraska's livestock industry and to grow
- 31 Nebraska agriculture.

- 1 (3) In carrying out its duty to protect the health of Nebraska's
- 2 livestock, the department may use USDA/APHIS/VS program standards to
- 3 determine and employ the most efficient and practical means for the
- 4 prevention, suppression, control, and eradication of dangerous diseases
- 5 among livestock and transmissible from other animals to livestock.
- 6 **Sec. 5.** Section 54-2948, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 7 amended to read:
- 8 54-2948 (1) Livestock imported into Nebraska shall comply with
- 9 federal animal disease traceability requirements for official
- 10 identification of animals as set forth in 9 C.F.R. part 86, as such part
- 11 existed on January 1, 2020, which the Legislature hereby adopts by
- 12 reference. If there is an inconsistency between such federal regulations
- 13 and the Animal Health and Disease Control Act, and any adopted and
- 14 promulgated rules or regulations or order issued by the department, the
- 15 requirements of the act, rules or regulations, or order control.
- 16 (2) An official identification device or method may be applied by an
- 17 animal's owner, the owner's representative, an accredited veterinarian,
- 18 or an approved tagging site. Official identification devices are intended
- 19 to provide permanent identification of livestock and to ensure the
- 20 ability to find the source of animal disease outbreaks. Removal of these
- 21 devices is prohibited except at the time of slaughter, upon the death of
- 22 the animal at any location, when an area veterinarian in charge replaces
- 23 a device, or as otherwise approved by the department.
- 24 (3) The application of any electronic identification device for
- 25 livestock manufactured by an entity with direct or indirect ties to any
- 26 <u>foreign adversary is prohibited within this state.</u>
- 27 <u>(4) The department shall not require the application or u</u>se of any
- 28 foreign manufactured device for electronic animal identification for the
- 29 purpose of identifying or tracking the movement of any livestock.
- 30 Sec. 6. Original sections 54-2901, 54-2902, 54-2939, and 54-2948,
- 31 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
