

LEGISLATIVE BILL 1216

Approved by the Governor March 6, 1972

Introduced by Wally Barnett, Jr., 26th District

AN ACT relating to hunting; to require persons hunting deer or antelope to wear a minimum amount of hunter orange as defined; and to provide a penalty.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. As used in this act, hunter orange shall mean a daylight fluorescent orange color with a dominant wave length between five hundred ninety-five and six hundred five nanometers, an excitation purity of not less than eighty-five per cent and a luminance factor of not less than forty per cent.

Sec. 2. Any person hunting deer or antelope with a firearm in this state shall display on his head, chest and back a total of not less than four hundred square inches of hunter orange material.

Sec. 3. Any person who violates the provisions of this act shall be fined not less than five dollars and not more than twenty-five dollars.
