PRESIDENT: This was just to insert it in the Journal, Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: All right.

PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach asks to be recognized at this time for some in-house announcements. The Chair recognizes the Speaker.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, if you will look at your agenda, we had prayer by the Chaplain, roll call, motion to advise the Governor we are in session, material on the Clerk's desk, and now I would like to then continue with the introduction of bills by reading by title. Now Select File numbers, and this is the reason I wish to make a statement here. We are going to start according to our agenda here on the unbracketed bills on Select File, and then when we have completed that work, we will go to the unbracketed bills on General File, and this is the reason for this. If someone who has a bracketed bill would like to bring it up, I will voice no objection, but I think in fairness to the Committee Chairman who must defend Committee action, and in many instances, the introducer who must defend his bill or those who wish to oppose it may be a little rusty on what the bill contains. Now this is the case in the bracketed bills which may be a little bit tougher than some of the other bills to give this body this week an opportunity to reconsider and restudy those amendments or those bills. So we will move on to the unbracketed bills, and if the introducer or the Committee Chairman has a desire to bracket that bill for a date certain or uncertain, if they feel as though they do not have all the things that enter into it and have not made their review, of this, I think all bills are entitled to good long consideration and knowledgeable consideration. So our agenda calls for us to start on LB 491 on Select File after the introduction of bills and then go to LB 120 on General File. I think this is fair to the introducer and fair to the Committee Chairman who do have a problem of remembering all the fine points of that bill and gives them an opportunity to review them.

PRESIDENT: Senator Keyes, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. President, I am having circulated among the Senators a resolution simply asking that the Legislature of the state of Nebraska go on record as supporting bringing the solar complex back to Nebraska and backing all the other organizations in Nebraska that are trying to get it into our state.
