Fowler and Senator Schmit; from the second district caucus, nominations for Exec Board, Senators Chambers and Senator Brennan and from the third district caucus, Senator Clark and Senator Lamb.

PRESIDENT: All right, you have heard the report. Senator Clark, will you move to approve the report of the caucuses?

SENATOR CLARK: Mr. President, I will move to accept the report of the committee.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. Discussion? Record your vote. Make the record.

CLERK: 38 ayes, 0 nays on Senator Clark's motion, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The report is approved and those nominated are elected. Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, I move that we proceed to the election of the remaining twelve members of the Committee on Committees and that we authorize the members residing within each of the four districts as enumerated in Rule 3, Section 17, to nominate three members to be elected by the legislative body to serve on the Committee on Committees.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. Record your vote. Make the record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays on Senator Kelly's motion, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion prevails. We will stand at ease and go back into the same caucuses. You have got what? Four caucuses. District 1 will be in its same place, that is at the rear of the Chamber on the south side. District 2 will be at the rear of the Chamber on the north side. District 3 will be in front of the Speaker's desk and District 4 will be in front of the presiding officer's desk. We have Districts 2, 3 and 4. We are missing District 1. Would the Chairman of District 1 please report to the Clerk's desk? Who is Chairman of Caucus 1? Make the report, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, from caucus number one, Senators Wesely, Burrows and Frank Lewis; from district number two, Senators Labeledz, Simon and Newell; from district number three caucus, Senators Schmit, Hasebroock and Reutzel; and from caucus from district number four, Senators Cope, Nichol and Cullan.
