SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, as we indicated, we would meet by caucus for the Committee on Committees Districts at the moment, one, two, three and four.

SENATOR MARSH: And that caucus will choose one to serve on Rules and one to serve on Intergovernmental.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Now the only legislators who are not present, Mr. Sergeant at Arms, will you find the following people, please: Senator Merz. Senator Fitzgerald, will you record your presence, please? Senator Merz, Senator Frank Lewis and Senator Chambers. Senator Marsh, do you still wish to raise the Call? Do you wish to pose your motion to raise the Call?

SENATOR MARSH: I, again, renew my request to raise the Call for purposes of caucusing and per the Speaker's request, one, to the southwest; two, to the southeast; three, to the northeast; and four, to the northwest area of this Chamber.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Clerk, will you clear the Board please. The motion is to raise the Call. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays to raise the Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion carried. Call is raised. You now can convene into your four respective groups.

SENATOR MARSH: The Administrative Rules and Regulations will be a decision by the four caucuses which means that two of the persons who are chosen by caucuses will not be members but you may bring those names to the Committee on Committees and they will be chosen as other members are chosen so some will be left out.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All right, now what report do you want from the Chairman of the various caucuses?

SENATOR MARSH: To give to their members of the Committee on Committees the decision made on who they would like to have on Rules, Legislative Rules, Intergovernmental and Administrative Rules and Regulations. So will caucus one come back into the area?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the Chair recognizes Senator Marsh to discuss the function of going into three Exec Board caucuses. Senator Marsh.
