SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair still would like to ask for a little more decorum in the House.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. A little more decorum in the forum if you will. I've said all that I have to say, really, which is of substance, and I said that to indicate again my support for this proposition.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: I call the question. I'll try again, I'll call the question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: We need 5 seconds. Are there 5 seconds? The question is, will the house go under call? All those in favor say aye, opposed no. I'm sorry, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Debate has ceased. Senator Newell, do you wish to close on your amendment...rule change?

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President and members of the body, I'd like to just make a brief close. Some of the arguments that were brought up are very interesting arguments. In our present system of government there is a need and a desire to have the proper checks and balances as the Constitution provides for them. To say that this is just a perfunctory sort of change is to really forget the importance of strengthening the committee's system, allowing those people who are most knowledgeable in a certain area to ask questions. People that are going to be dealing with these executive heads on down the road, etc. If you know anything about the committee system, and I've given an analogy about the Revenue Committee, is that it's good to know how soon we're going to get fiscal notes, and whether or not that director or the new commissioner is going to provide that kind of information. It's good to know exactly what his ideas are on property tax administration, how actively he'll suggest to the Governor that the Board of Equalization will meet, etc. I want to say this simply, is this two-year change, by putting it off for two years we've taken the politics out. Johnny DeCamp indicated that the Governor is in agreement with this change...with the two-year delay it
