Mr. President, your committee on Revenue whose Chairman is Senator Cal Carsten to whom was referred LB 187 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File.

Mr. President, Senator Kahle moves to withdraw LB 300. That will properly be laid over until tomorrow, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: It will be laid over. We will proceed then to agenda item #5, General File, commencing with LB 289, an Education Committee bill, and the Clerk will read the title.

CLERK: Read title of LB 289. The bill was originally read on January 16, 1979. It was referred directly to General File, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. President, members of the body, this bill is a matter of housekeeping. Originally, the law stated that the Commissioner of Education's office should be located in the State Capitol and all this bill does is to say that the Commissioner of Education's office shall be located at Lincoln and I think this is appropriate now since the Commissioner's office has been out of this Capitol Building for quite some time and we should clean up that law and make it applicable to where the office is located, either the State Office Building or somewhere in Lincoln where it has been for the past I don't know how many years. I move for the advancement of LB 289 to E & R Initial.

SENATOR DWORAK: A question of Senator Koch.
