SENATOR CLARK: No, wait a minute, let's not get into something here on this. This isn't there. In the first place I don't think that you know what you are talking about and I hate to say that, but I don't. It has never happened. We are still looking for the first time in diagnostic....

SENATOR SIMON: Excuse me, Senator Clark.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Simon, do you have a question to Senator Clark?

SENATOR SIMON: Well I will just make some general comments then if Senator Clark is going to talk on my time. Senator Clark, I can give you a copy of the transcript of the hearing in which a doctor has said that it has happened. Now this is one of the things that we have discussed in the committee and we have had arguments about. You know, I have not agreed with you in the past on many occasions but I have never said that you did not know what you were talking about, but that is your prerogative. But it has happened in the past which is a concern that I have had, and Senator Dworak has had and some others. The only question, I was only asking a simple question which could have required a civil explanation, and that was since reactions have occurred and since it was brought out by testimony in the committee, and I refresh your memory and I will send these down to you if you would want to take a look at them.

SENATOR CLARK: You don't have to, I have read it all. I have heard it all.

SENATOR SIMON: All right, adverse reactions did occur. I was concerned about the aspects of the medical profession that an optometrist would know how to act if a reaction did occur. That is the concern that I had, Senator Clark.
