SENATOR WARNER: Yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is there any other discussion on the amendments, the committee amendments, to 192? Senator Carsten, do you have any closing? This is on your amendments or the committee amendments.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, members, no closing other than I think the amendment is strictly clarifying and does what the Appropriations Committee needs to have done for their operations. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to adopt the committee amendments to 192. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the committee amendments are adopted. The Chair recognizes Senator Warner for comments as the introducer. Do you move the bill be advanced to E & R for review?

SENATOR WARNER: Right, Mr. President, I so move.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I recognize Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: As I have explained the bill in discussing the amendment, what it essentially does is assures that any refund that is applied for, one of these institutions, University, State Colleges or Department of Education, on sales tax paid on capital construction projects, that those refunds are returned to the same fund as supplied the original money for the purchase of the structure and what we are particularly interested in, of course, is that general fund money is returned to the general fund and that it does not become, in effect, an additional appropriation through the refund route to their cash fund to be used for unrestricted purposes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is there any other discussion? The motion is to advance LB 192 as amended to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.
