PRESIDENT: Have you all voted? The House is under Call.

CLERK: Senator Simon voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dworak voting no.

CLERK: Senator Dworak changing from yes to no. Senator Brennan voting no. Senator Duis voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Just a minute, Senator Marsh. There is a couple of votes he wants to get in. Do you have all the votes you were working on? Okay. Now. Motion to raise the Call, Senator Marsh.

SENATOR NICHOL: Roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: Announce the vote before we raise the Call. Roll call vote will be requested. Senator Marsh, will you wait until we get the roll call vote then? We will have a roll call vote and then I will entertain Senator Marsh's motion to raise the Call. So let's have a roll call vote on the committee amendment to LB 131. Proceed with the roll call vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Roll call vote taken. (See page 472, Legislative Journal.) 24 ayes, 20 nays on the adoption of the committee amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, as the bill now stands, the penalty would fall on the driver of the school bus, if it is not in accordance with the criminal code. So now we have the bill that would make the driver responsible for not changing the color of the school bus or not removing the other devices from the school bus.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nichol, I believe this is a bill by the committee, by the Education Committee, is it not?

SENATOR NICHOL: Okay.

PRESIDENT: So I think we will recognize Senator Koch to explain the bill at this point since the committee amendments have failed. In the meantime, I will recognize Senator Marsh's motion to raise the Call. If there are no objections, the Call is raised. Senator Koch, you may proceed to explain the bill.
