SENATOR WESELY: Senator Nichol, if you look at the bill on Page 4, this is the definition of handicapped...for the purposes of this act, physically handicapped persons shall mean visually handicapped persons and those permanently, etc., etc.

SENATOR NICHOL: Okay.

SENATOR WESELY: They are included under this act. I realized that problem when I added that.

SENATOR NICHOL: Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: A question of Senator Wesely.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely, will you respond?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes.

SENATOR VICKERS: Senator Wesely, I just now read the bill briefly. It does say may in all cases, does it not? You're... we're not requiring a small village to provide these types of parking places, are we?

SENATOR WESELY: This is enabling legislation, not mandatory.

SENATOR VICKERS: Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion then on LB 146? Senator Wesely, do you have any closing?

SENATOR WESELY: No. Well, I'd just like to move the LB 146 to E & R for Initial.

PRESIDENT: Alright, motion before the House is the advance of LB 146 to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. LB 146 is advanced to E & R Initial. This brings up LB 108.

CLERK: Mr. President, Legislative Bill 108 was a bill introduced by the Business and Labor Committee and signed by the members thereof. (Read by title LB 108.) The bill was
