SENATOR MARSH: Thirty seconds, Senator.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you. I just want to close by saying we need to recognize our limitations. We are not a fact-finding body that can compete with what the courts do in fact-finding and weighing of evidence. This is not a matter of policy. This is a matter of fact.

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Madam Chairman.

SENATOR MARSH: We are now ready and will vote on the kill motion. To indefinitely postpone, vote green. To refrain from indefinitely postponing, vote red. Senator Marsh voting red.

CLERK: Senator Marsh voting no.

SENATOR MARSH: Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 22 nays on the motion to indefinitely postpone, Mr. President.

SENATOR MARSH: Motion has lost. What will you do with the bill?

SENATOR MARESH: I move that LB 108 be advanced to E & R Initial.

SENATOR MARSH: All those in favor signify by voting aye, opposed no. Senator Marsh voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Marsh voting aye

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Maresch.

SENATOR MARESH: Madam Chairman, how many are excused?

SENATOR MARSH: There are eight excused.

SENATOR MARESH: We had better have a Call of the House, I am afraid.
