PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Kremer, you may close on the committee amendments.

SENATOR KREMER: I would like to ask Senator Murphy a question in my closing.

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy, will you respond?

SENATOR KREMER: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: Yes.

SENATOR KREMER: Do you agree with Senator Cullan, and I was going to remind you of it, too, we are talking about the amendment. You were not addressing yourself to the amendments, were you?

SENATOR MURPHY: No, I wasn't. The timing was poor, Senator Kremer. I do support the committee amendments, yes.

SENATOR KREMER: Thank you, Senator. You aren't very often mixed up but you were this morning. I have no closing. I think my explanation and Senator Cullan's explanation, I think we all understand what we are trying to do. I move the amendments be adopted.

PRESIDENT: The motion before the House is the adoption of the committee amendments on LB 26. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the committee amendments on LB 26? I will wait for you, Senator Burrows. I will wait for you, Senator Kelly. Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the committee amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion passes. The committee amendments are adopted. Motion on the desk. Read the motion, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Murphy moves to amend: Read Murphy amendment on page 541, Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: This amendment speaks to the issue that I misspoke to a moment ago and restores the one-quarter in lieu of the one mill and I think I have addressed it rather fully. I think many of you are aware of the issues I speak of. I simply say that we cannot continue to burden the people at home with mandatory provisions that allow
