whatsoever. But until we quit building recreational areas and until we quit building snowmobile paths and bicycle paths, until we stop fencing and lighting tennis courts, then I say to you the NRD has far too much money now. We have a Game and Parks Commission. We have a local government to do this sort of thing but we are expending monies intended for conservation purposes in other areas and then saying we have run out of money, we have a problem, and, of course, the answer to every problem is more money. You know that. I know that. I ask that you support this amendment, and if the NRDs can come back and show that their involvement in conservation matters is anywhere near what it should be proportionately to their involvement in road building and recreation, possibly I would consider it. I don't know, but I do not like adding funding in the face of the piggybacking effect that property values are going to have. I ask for the adoption of the amendment and I ask for a Call of the House, Mr. Speaker.

PRESIDENT: Are you asking for a Call of the House first? All right. A Call of the House has been requested. The motion is on the Call of the House first. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. The question is, shall the House go under Call? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 6 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The House is under Call. The Sergeant at Arms will secure the aisles, get all the nonlegislative off the aisles. All legislators return to their desks. Record your presence. The House is under Call. Senator Cullan, are you here? Senator Sieck, are you here? Senator Keyes, are you with us. Senator Schmit, I know you are here. Senator Lamb, somewhere around. Senator Murphy, I think Senator Fowler is the only one who is not here. Do you want Senator Fowler before we commence? Senator Fowler is now with us. Did you want a roll call vote now? Just vote. All right. The question before the House, the House is under Call, everybody at their desks, the question is the adoption of the Murphy amendment to LB 26. Anybody want to hear the amendment read? I knew that would be asked. Senator Duis wants it read, so, Mr. Clerk, would you read the amendment.
