SPEAKER MARVEL: Call of the House has been requested. All those in favor...clear the board. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 4 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take their seats. Unauthorized personnel please leave the stage, and record your presence.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Kahle, do you want to turn your button off? Senator Wesely, will you turn your button off, please? Senator Kennedy here? Who's excused, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Clark, Dworak, Hasebroock, Labeledz and Lewis are excused.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Keyes, will you please record your presence? Senator Warner, would you record your presence? Senator Burrows, would you record your presence? Senator Rumery. Sergeant at Arms, will you please...Senator DeCamp, would you please record your presence? All legislators are to be in their seats. We're under Call. Senator Cullan, will you please record your presence? Is Senator Haberman there? Let's see, Senator Wesely, would you record your presence, please? Senator Wesely, we do not have Senator Kennedy, Senator Rumery. Senator Rumery, would you record your presence, please? We're under Call. Senator Labeledz, do you want to record your presence? The Clerk is authorized to accept votes. We're voting on the approval of the Committee amendment to LB 63.

CLERK: Senator George voting aye. Senator Landis voting aye. Senator Kennedy voting aye. Senator Fitzgerald voting aye. Senator Burrows voting aye. Senator Rumery voting aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 7 nays on the adoption of the Committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the bill is adopted, and Senator Nichol, did you move the Call to be raised? The Call is raised. Senator Koch, we've adopted the Committee amendments. Are you ready to...is there any further discussion on the bill?

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, I will yield the floor to the introducer, Senator Wesely.
