SENATOR MURPHY: I think there has been adequate discussion of the problem. If the Department of Education will come forth next year and say that they have requested that the schools voluntarily accomplish this program under their present structure and under their own authority, and that they have refused, I shall be the first to support reviving this proposition. For the moment, I think it is unnecessary, even possibly unconstitutional legislation, and I move that the bill be indefinitely postponed.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the indefinite postponement of LB 63. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? I'll call for the vote twice more and then we're going to record it. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Clerk record the vote. Record vote's been called for. Who asked for the record vote? Senator Simon.

CLERK: (Record vote may be found on Pages 588 and 589 of the Legislative Journal.) 23 ayes...excuse me 24 ayes, 20 nays, 5 not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the bill is indefinitely postponed. We're ready to go to LB 130. Oh, okay, Mr. Clerk, what have you got on your desk?

CLERK: Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports that we have examined engrossed LB 22 and find the same correctly engrossed, 53 correctly engrossed, 67 correctly engrossed, 114 correctly engrossed, 215 correctly engrossed. Signed Senator Wesely, Chairman.
