SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes.

SENATOR WARNER: That then the impact of, in fact the very words is the fiscal analyst estimates the Commission will need no additional funds to complete the other three assignments contained in the bill, and there is further comment to indicate there may be some additional cost in terms of postage and printing and those kind of things, but any such costs would be minimal at the most. I understand that the Director had indicated at the hearing that he thought the cost...the balance of it was something under five thousand dollars, however, in this case I suspect that they really need no additional funds.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Committee amendments to LB 141. All those in favor of adopting the amendments vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? We're adopting the Committee amendments to LB 141. Have you all voted? Clerk record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion...on the adoption of the Committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion's adopted, and Senator Koch, do you move the advancement of the bill as amended?

SENATOR KOCH: Unless there are questions, Mr. Speaker, but...

SPEAKER MARVEL: Well, I have a comment to make, but I thought you wanted to make the motion first.

SENATOR KOCH: I would move that LB 141 be advanced to E & R as amended.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Cullan, do you wish to be recognized? Your light's on. Okay. Senator Murphy, we've examined the fiscal note. I've discussed it with the Appropriations Chairman, and the decision is with the adoption of the Committee amendments, the cost has been stricken and as the fiscal analyst records, the cost is now minimal, so I'm going to rule that we can advance the bill.

SENATOR MURPHY: If I thought I could get 25 votes I might challenge you, but I really don't care to challenge you under the concept of the amendment, but I would ask that the fiscal note be updated so that when we get to Select File on this issue, we can give it proper consideration under our own rules.
