

in the process of being prepared, but when I see that local government is required to provide whatever information the Department of Revenue requests, which is appropriate I suppose...well, it is appropriate, but nevertheless it seems to me that as broad as the language is, it seems to me that either it ought to be written in a more limited form as to what is to be required, so that any kind of a cost or use of that information could be identified better, but certainly not in the way that it presently stands. It seems to me the broad amount of information that is requested is far in excess to what can be reasonably expected to be acquired at the cost that is indicated.

Is that right?
