CLERK: 22 ayes, 1 nay to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators will take their seats. Unauthorized personnel leave the floor. Will you please record your presence? Senator Goodrich and Senator Kremer are excused. The Clerk will accept votes on the motion because a record vote has been requested.

CLERK: Senator Duis voting aye. Senator Marsh voting no. Senator Clark voting aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Let's see, Senator Kremer is excused and Senator Goodrich is excused. I think everybody else is recorded here.

CLERK: Senator Stoney is voting no. Senator Vickers voting no. Senator Koch voting no. Senator Fitzgerald voting no.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The request is to raise the Call. The Call is raised. The Clerk can announce the vote. Excuse me, it is a record vote. I am sorry.

CLERK: Mr. President. Read record vote found on page 651, Legislative Journal. 22 ayes, 22 nays, 2 excused and not voting and 3 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: 22 to 22, the motion does not carry. The amendment is not adopted. What is the next amendment?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Venditte now moves to amend. His amendments may be found on page 620 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: What page?

CLERK: 620 of the Legislative Journal, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Venditte, are you going to take these (1), (2), (3)? How do you wish to do this?

SENATOR VENDITTE: Yes, as the Clerk and I had discussed earlier, Mr. Speaker. I thought it would be best for the amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: (1), (2), (3), okay. Do you want the first
