So you have done something which I think is difficult to explain, but, Senator Johnson, I applaud you for it because the bill is rapidly taking on the character that I want to see it have. Before it is over, it is going to be as unique as it was when it was first introduced.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp and then Senator Johnson.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I again urge you to adopt the amendment. It is not a totally subjective thing. It is subjective to the degree that the doctor is in good faith using his medical judgment but we know he didn't become a doctor without getting some training, education, knowing standard medical practices, this kind of thing. Both sides are satisfied with the amendment. On the second amendment, you will hear...I think we have some additional minor corrections there that Senator Johnson is going to propose. You know, I would like to say something else. In the eight years I have been here, my very good friend, Senator Chambers, and others, have repeatedly said, oh, DeCamp, you crazy hoot owl, that is unconstitutional. That is unconstitutional and even you, you poor dumb creature, should know that. I think that of the bills I put amendments on, sponsored, so on and so forth, been involved in heavily, that something like 30 or 40 have gone to the Nebraska Supreme Court on one little technicality or another and one or two that you and I played with, Ernie, the self-defense law that the Omaha cop said was just terrible as ever and so on, of those, the first one, the first amendment, the first anything has yet to be held unconstitutional, whether it is products liability, medical malpractice, self-defense laws, so on and so forth. Now, you say, ah, ha, DeCamp, but what about that abortion law? Point of order, it hasn't been held unconstitutional yet. Now has it? There have been issues raised and there is an injunction saying when it gets to the court it might be unconstitutional in certain areas but, Ernie, we are going to get it corrected here before that ever happens and, see, ole John will slip through the chain again. The idea is to get this bill in as close to reasonably constitutional form as we can while giving the input of the pro-life group and the pro-life group, as anybody knows, is extremely firm in trying to ensure that wherever possible abortion does not occur. Now I think that is the goal we are working for within the guidelines of the Supreme Court. You have a white copy of the entire bill. Read it. Read this bill from beginning to end. Read the preamble. You will see where we are doing a heck of a job. Now Mr. Cunningham representing the Catholic Conference and pro-life groups would say, hey, wait, you
