that would be amendment #3. Okay, have you got it so recorded? We are voting on amendment #3. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion carried and the amendment is adopted. Now proceed.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Okay, go to the second page of the amendments starting at line 10 it says insert the following new sections, and depending upon how this ultimately all ends up, E & R might have to correct section 10 and make some of the numbers but it just says into there, the underlined language, "Under no circumstances shall the compilations of information include the name of any attending physician or identify in any respect facilities where abortions are performed." And then the next one, section 11, "This act shall become operative thirty days after its effective date." Okay, reasons for these, number one reason, I wanted to clarify basically what was an Attorney General's opinion that said, as I understand it, essentially the same thing that you can't go handing out the names of gals who are involved. The second thing, the thirty day date. We were going to put the emergency clause on. The reason for that is so that it resolves for both sides the Supreme Court case. They decided, as I understand it, that some period of time is necessary so they can both get their act together, so to speak, meet with the judge and deal with the new statute rather than the old one. So I would urge you to adopt those two amendments, and as I say, I think that may be getting close to the last places of some agreement. From there on....

SPEAKER MARVEL: Now let me understand your proposal, this is on page 639. We are talking about line 10, section 10; line 24, section 11. Do you consider this one amendment or two?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Consider it one, what the heck.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, then it is amendment #5. I am sorry, amendment #4 on page 639 includes section 10 and section 11. All those in favor of that known as amendment #4 vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on amendment #4 on page 639. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.
