SPEAKER MARVEL: The previous question has been called for. All those in favor... Do I see five hands? All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to cease debate.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Debate has ceased. Senator Kelly, do you have any other remarks in regard to your reconsideration motion? Okay, the motion is to reconsider our act. We have two votes on this. The first one is reconsideration. The motion is to reconsider our action on Senator Nichol's motion on privacy made yesterday. All those in favor of reconsideration vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 4 nays on the motion to reconsider, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Now we are voting on the Nichol amendment to LB 316. All those in favor of that amendment vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 2 nays on the adoption of Senator Nichol's amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the amendment is adopted. The Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Move the bill be advanced. I have no closing.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Landis, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR LANDIS: To only make one brief statement as to the disposition of LB 316, Mr. Speaker. I want to state that in my opinion the object of our existing law and this newly amended statute, LB 316, is an attempt to create
