SENATOR LAMB: Okay, I'll speak to the Committee amendment, but I'd also like to amend the Committee amendment, but my question... a question of Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay.

SENATOR LAMB: I just want to know your definition of a home farm ranch. This poses some problems for many of us out there, because if the land is divided by a road, does that mean you can't hunt on the other side of the road, or where your residence is, or how does that work?

SENATOR REUTZEL: Certainly not, Senator, you know that.

SENATOR LAMB: Pardon.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Certainly not, and you know that that is not the intention. Home land...if you've got six sections out there, and you live in one corner and that could be subdivided by umpteen roads, that is still your land and you don't...and that provision applies.

SENATOR LAMB: Does it have to be contiguous in any manner?

SENATOR REUTZEL: Not as I read the amendment.
