descriptive adjectives but the autopsy was performed on this child and all of the crevices in the brain were filled with pus, down into the spinal cord was a solid mass of pus because the child had an ailment which could have been corrected but the parents chose not to let the child go to the doctor and the description was to the effect that the parents had watched the child become moribund, have convulsions and suffer the other agonies that are associated with this disease and did nothing. So I think an adult has the right to be a fool if he or she wants to be, whether it is a fool for Christ as St. Paul said he was or a fool who wants to ride a motorcycle without a helmet as a lot of other people say they want to be, but when it comes to a bill that relates to the welfare of a child, I begin to draw some lines and what I am going to do, and that is all I want to ask you, Senator Koch, thank you. What I want to do is amend Senator Koch's amendment, and as I told you, his amendment would be designed to reinstate all of this language. What I would strike in line 12 the two words "physical examination" because should a child be examined by a doctor and found to have a contagious disease, perhaps the foolish parents would want that child to go ahead and suffer and they are going to think that child either into good health or into the cemetery but not everybody else's child should be exposed to an infectious ailment. So by striking the words physical examination, you are not requiring this child to be subjected to the inoculation or oral giving of any type of medication that would be designed to immunize the child against certain ailments. So I want you, if you agree with what I am saying, to look at line 12, the second line 12 on the white sheet, and strike the two words "physical examination" from Senator Koch's amendment and that would be an amendment to his amendment.

SENATOR NICHOL Are you offering that amendment at this time? We are now speaking to the amendment on the amendment. Senator Maresh, did you want to speak on the amendment to the amendment? We are now voting on the Chambers amendment which strikes...Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Chairman, I understand Senator Chambers and his amendment. He is striking the physical examination and/or. In other words, the amendment would read that they would not have to prescribe to the immunization facet but they would have to have the physical examination. This, of course, and I understand what Senator Chambers is saying, and as I have said before, I concur with what he is saying to us. However, Senator Chambers, I committed myself to the
