CLERK: 10 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR NICHOL: We are under Call. Senator Koch, shall we accept votes? Senator Koch, shall we accept votes?

SENATOR KOCH: Please.

CLERK: Senator Frank Lewis voting aye. Senator Fitzgerald voting aye. Senator Carsten had voted aye. Senator Cullan voting aye. Senator Murphy voting aye. Senator Brennan voting aye.

SENATOR NICHOL: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 6 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to adopt Senator Koch's amendment.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Simon moves we raise the Call. All those in favor say aye, opposed. We are not under Call now. (Mike not activated) amendment, Senator Koch. No, excuse me, go back to the bill, you have no other amendments, correct?

SENATOR KOCH: No other amendments, Mr. Chairman.

SENATOR NICHOL: Now we are back on the bill.

SENATOR KOCH: That's correct. The bill as I mentioned a moment ago now with the exception of Senator Chambers' amendment is that we have added mumps to the immunization aspect of it. We have a bill now that says that you shall have a physical prior to entering school, that you will be given sixty days to comply and then there will be a written notice to the parents to comply, and then if you are a transfer student, from the time you transfer you have sixty days as well. So there are provisions to make it flexible and I believe the bill as now written is ready to be advanced. The committee amendments have been adopted. Part of my amendment is adopted and I move to advance LB 59 to E & R Initial.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, a question of Senator Koch. Senator Koch, this physical examination, the record from the doctor, is the whole examination transmitted to the school or does it just say the child is healthy and has no disease that would be transmitted to other children?
